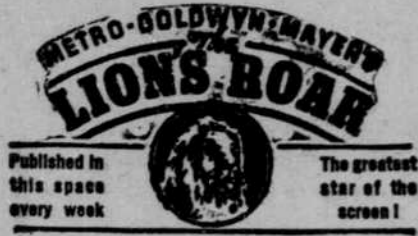


NOTE: Service-Forces Xmas Packages

Must Be Mailed Between Sept. 15 and Oct. 15 To Assure Delivery By Christmas Time

The Army Service Forces, which is responsible for the safe delivery of mail to soldiers overseas, has announced that all Christmas packages for army personnel overseas must be mailed between Sept. 15 and Oct. 15, inclusive, if they are to reach the men in time for the Christmas season, headquarters Seventh Service Command said today. The time period was arranged by the ASF in cooperation with the Post Office department.

Every possible effort will be made to speed the gift packages on their way, however, the cooperation of the sender in observing postal regulations is necessary. The regulations for the mailing of Christmas gift parcels are:

TIME: Sept. 15 to Oct. 15, inclusive. Only during this period the sender need not obtain the soldier's request for the package. Every Christmas must also be lettered, "Christmas Parcel," so that post office officials can give the package immediate attention.

SIZE AND WEIGHT: Because of the urgent need for shipping space to transport vital war materials, the weight of Christmas packages shall not exceed five pounds, nor shall its size exceed 15 inches in length or 36 inches in length and girth combined.

Not more than one Christmas parcel will be accepted for mailing in any one week by the same person to the same addressee.

PREPARATION: As parcels must travel a long way, all articles should be packed in metal, wood, solid or double-faced corrugated fiber board or telescoping cardboard boxes. Fiberboard and cardboard boxes must also be wrapped in strong paper and securely tied with twine.

Sharp pointed instruments, such as knives, must have edges protected so that they do not cut through their wrappings and injure other packages or post office employees. Sealed merchant packages of candy, cigars, tobacco and toilet articles may be included in package contents without affecting the parcel post classification.

As each parcel sent overseas is subject to examination before sending, delay in handling will be minimized by securing the covering of the package to permit ready inspection.

PROHIBITED ARTICLES No perishable articles may be sent. Intoxicants, inflammable materials, poisons and compositions which may kill or injure any person or damage the mails are likewise unmailable.

ADDRESSING: Addresses must be legible and must include the soldier's name, rank, army serial number, branch of service, organization, Army Post Office number, (APO), and the post office through which the parcel is to be routed. The sender must also indicate his full name and address.

PERMISSIBLE ADDITIONS: In addition to the name and address of the sender, inscriptions such as "Merry Christmas" or "With Best Wishes" may be placed on the outside of the package, where they will not interfere with the address. A card bearing the same notations may be enclosed inside the box. Books may bear a simple dedicatory inscription not of a nature of personal correspondence, stickers or labels, which resemble postage stamps, may not be placed on the outside of parcels.

INSURANCE: Packages to persons receiving mail through an APO number cannot be insured.

Guest speaker for the occasion will be Senator William Langer of North Dakota and one of the consistent supporters for the reorganization of the Committee. Other speakers on the program will include A. Phillip Randolph, president of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters and Provisional Committee, Dr. Lawrence Erwin, Nat'l Executive Board Member "March on Washington" Movement, Attorney Thurman T. Dodson, Chairman Local "March on Washington" Movement, B. F. McLaurin, Int'l Field Organizer, Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters. A number of firemen from many sections of the South will dramatize their own amazing story of the worst discriminatory practices involving Negro firemen. On Monday, Sept. 13th a conference is being called by the Save The Fair Employment Practice Committee at Twelfth St. Y.M.C.A. to set up machinery to make the President's Committee a Permanent Agency to deal with problems of discrimination during the Post War Period.

Organizations are requested to send delegates to this conference and individuals who are interested are also invited. Plans are completed for a most interesting week of activity for those who attend the hearings on railroad discriminations Sept. 15, 16 and 17th states B. F. McLaurin, Director of the Program.

COLOR QUESTION POSED TO ROOSEVELT, CHURCHILL

New York—Consideration of the problem of the color line in matter of victory and peace was urged upon President Franklin D. Roosevelt and Prime Minister Winston Churchill in their deliberations in Quebec this week by Walter White NAACP secretary. The complete message:

"May I respectfully urge inclusion in your deliberations consideration of practical means of inclusion of welfare of colored people of world. The problem of the color line is beyond doubt one of three major issues of the 20th Century. Unless it is met and solved the colored peoples of India, China, Burma, Africa, the West Indies the United States and other parts of the world will continue to view sceptically assertions that:

Plain Talk..

It would appear important to examine thoroughly a policy which has served to create in the normally placid Negro population a leath of bitterness which has no parallel in the history of the Negro in America. This deep-seated resentment contrary to widely accepted opinion is not due to Negro agitators, nor is it due primarily to incitement by the Negro press. It is the natural reaction of the Negro confronted by severe limitations based on color and race, the while the nation, of which he is a citizen proclaims the virtues of democracy and calls upon him in common with other citizens to defend it with his life. The contrast between the professions of his government and its actual practice, insofar as he is concerned, has burned deeply into his soul more sensitive to the meaning of Democracy now than ever before. It could not be otherwise when every waking hour of his life he is called upon to make some sacrifice for the nation in which he is a second class citizen.

This is a war for freedom and democracy. Failure to solve this problem will inevitably mean other wars caused only incidentally by the struggle for freedom of colored people. More certain as a cause would be continuation of white imperialism in exploitation of colored people. We know you both are aware of the need of solving this question. We feel reasonably certain it is included in the agenda of the present meeting. However, we urge you to take such action as will galvanize into even more active support of the United Nations by colored peoples because they are assured that they too will share in the freedom for which we fight."

There must come a time when our government must face the issue as to whether the Negro shall be treated as a citizen in all which that implies or whether he shall be treated as a pariah. In fairness to the Negro, yes in fairness to the nation itself the policy of evasion, of temporizing, of appeasement must be abandoned, and constructive steps must be taken to carry out the constitutional guarantee which were designed to secure all citizens in their right to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

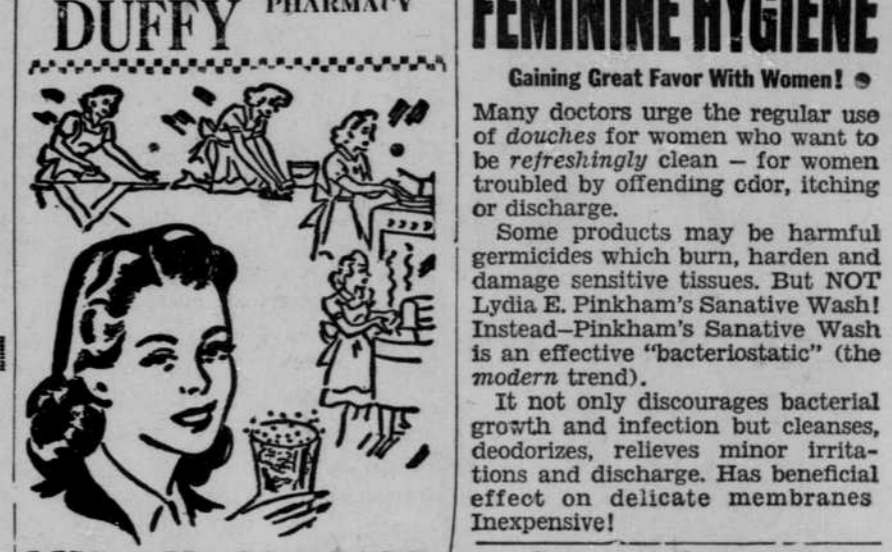
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Fourteenth and Fifteenth Amendment to the Constitution, even though they are often disregarded has served to prevent even greater and more widespread violations of the Negro's citizenship rights. However, even if this were true, there is no valid reason to believe that the majority of the American people are fundamentally or seriously opposed to the extension of complete democratic rights to the Negro. Not even in the South is the racial problem as hopeless as it seems. What America lacks is courageous and far-sighted leadership. But time and the inexorable laws of progress are making it more and more difficult to live in a world where status is conditioned by race and color alone. After all the arch proponent of this savage concept now foresees his inevitable doom as the shadows of the Kremlin lengthen and the legions of Red Russia remorselessly press toward the West. A free world is in the making. The problem of race in America therefore concerns more than the Negro. It concerns America's right to share in the creation of a new and better world.

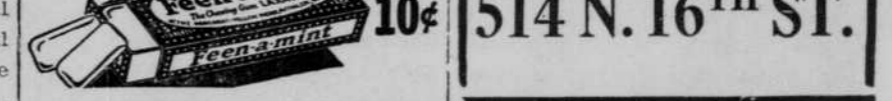
