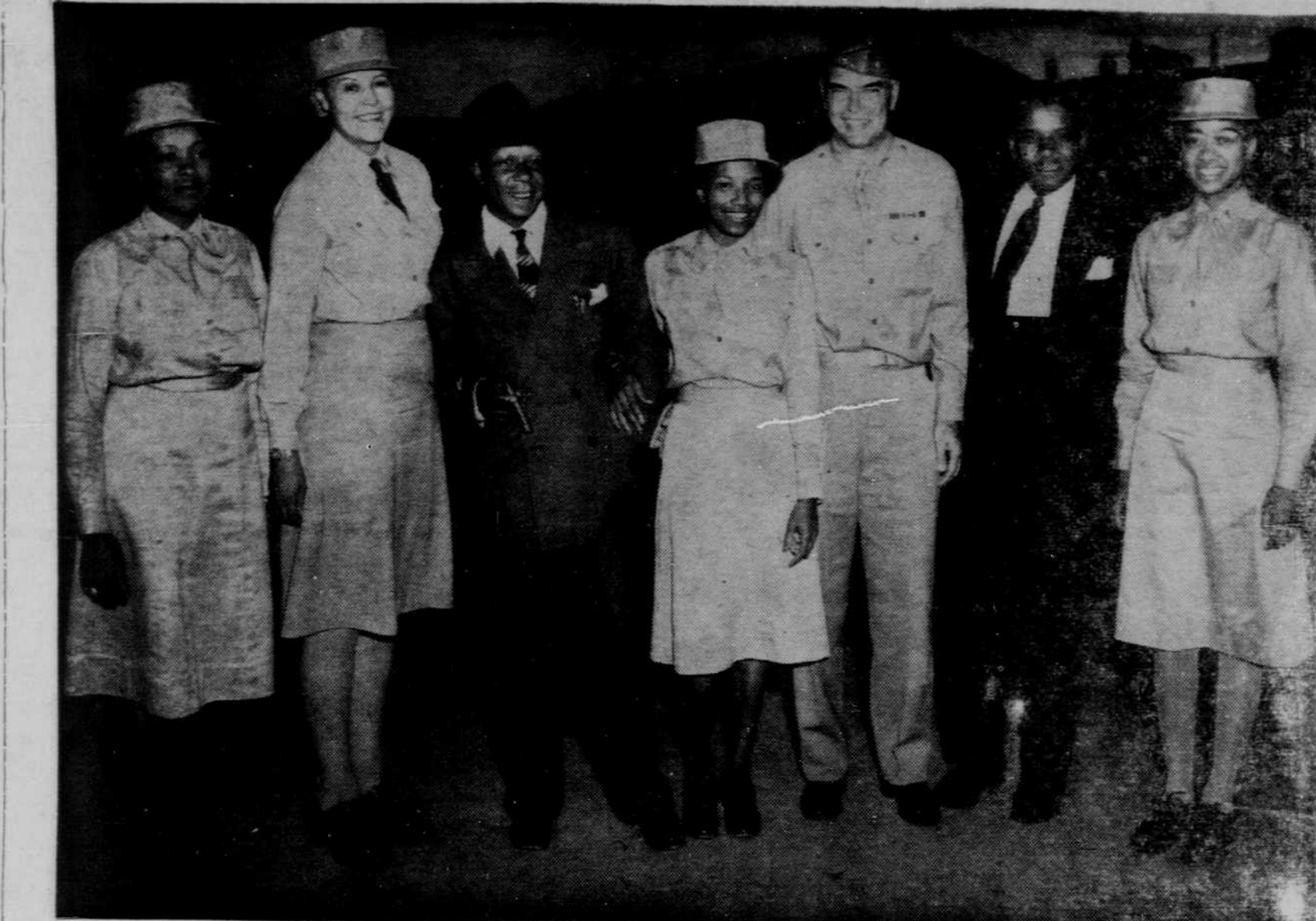

NPC GIVE SPECIAL XMAS GIFTS TO EMPLOYEES SERVING OVERSEAS

A special Christmas gift from the Nebraska Power Co. to each of its employees serving overseas, was to have started on its way from Omaha this week. Each of these employees will receive a money order for \$15. These are expected to reach their various destinations around December 25.

Additional money orders in the same amount for 108 Nebraska Power employees stationed in the United States will be mailed Dec. 1.

Previous to its money order mailing, the Nebraska Power Company sent each of its employees in the service a gift package. The presents for Navy men were mailed October 30, and those for the soldiers, October 15.

A personal greeting from E. Davidson, president of the firm, accompanied the money orders.

CITIES AND TOWNS FACED WITH POWER ISSUES DEFEAT POLITICAL MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL.

Cities and towns all over America, faced by public power issues like Omaha's are defeating political management and control of their electric systems by overwhelming majorities.

El Paso, Texas, with a 4 to 1 bitter defeat of public ownership is only one of the attitude of the people everywhere. The New York Times, in a recent article, stated that with the exception of a small community of about 1,000 population every city and town that had public ownership elections during this year, defeated public ownership and voted to continue the business management of their electric service by companies similar to Nebraska Power Company.

Omaha's also will vote overwhelmingly to keep Nebraska Power. There is no general public demand for public ownership and the people know they now have good service and low rates.

Washington, D. C. (Special to Press Photo Service) Walter White, National Executive Secretary of NAACP, was the target this week of sharp criticism hurled by Edgar G. Brown, president of the National Negro Council. Brown in an open letter to representatives of this newspaper, demanded the ousting of Mr. White, and among the many reasons he asserted was that his foolish dismissal of Dean William Pickens, whom Brown claimed spent 20 years of good service with the Association. The National Negro Council head also charged Mr. White with sending a telegram to the \$300,000,000 federal aid to public education bill, urging the Senator to withdraw the equal rights proposal.

LENA HORNE ARRIVES IN NEW YORK

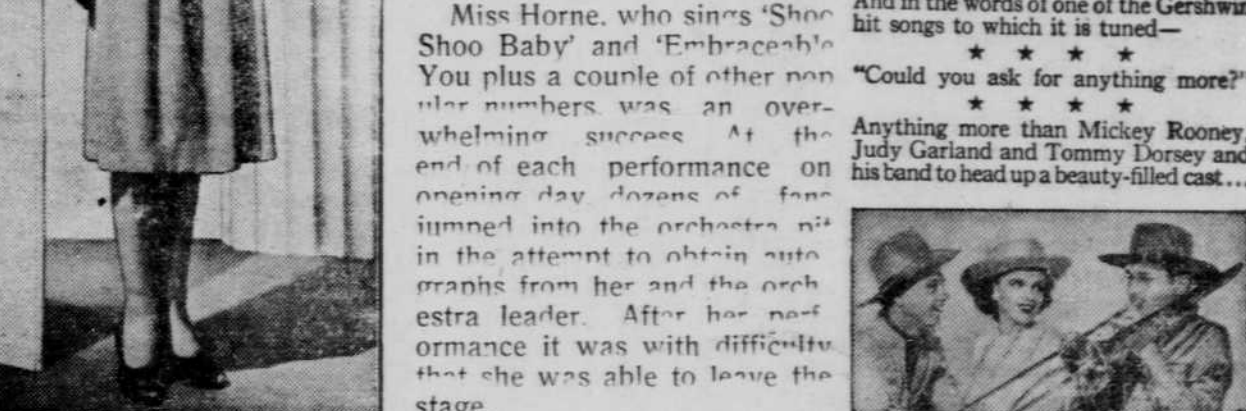

LENA HORNE SENSATIONAL IN CAPITOL THEATRE APPEARANCE

New York City—The first entirely colored show ever to play at the Capitol Theatre starring Duke Ellington with the glamorous and beautiful M-G-M star Lena Horne as a special added attraction, is turning out to be a sensation. More than a thousand people had gathered to gain admission as early as 9 o'clock on opening day. Dozens of policemen had to be rushed to the scene to keep the crowd in order and by 9:30, long before the first star show was due, the line stretched all the way down from Broadway to 8th Avenue.

Miss Horne, who sings "Shoo Baby" and "Embraceable You" plus a couple of other new numbers was an overwhelming success. At the end of each performance on opening day dozens of fans jimmied into the orchestra pit in the attempt to obtain autographs from her and the orchestra leader. After her performance it was with difficulty that she was able to leave the stage.

At the end of the first day the box-office take was more than \$11,000, and the end of the first week found the theatre coffers overflowing with \$85,000. This is more than the Capitol has grossed in a single week in the twenty five years of its existence. All in all, it's a fitting tribute to the popularity of M-G-M's newest starlet.
