is to be realized. "And now is the time," he asserted. The speaker declared that fascism and discrimination are on the increase in the U. S. and called attention to the fact that discrimination is the government policy regarding the Negro; anti-Catholic movements exist in the south and midwest, there are 200 anti-Semitic groups in America and persistent discrimination in the armed forces, in war industries and in government against Negroes continues.

Top Hats and Tom Toms

This picture was taken in Monrovia and is one of the illustrations in the new book "Top Hats and Tom-Toms" by Elizabeth Dearmin Furbay, just published by the Ziff-Davis Publishing Company. "Top Hats and Tom-Toms"—a lively, informative, and brilliantly detailed picture of the colorful Republic of Liberia—goes a long way toward dispelling the obscurity of this little African Negro country. The author draws on a wealth of knowledge acquired during three years residence in Monrovia, the capital, where her husband, Doctor John Harvey Furbay, served as head of the College of West Africa.

From the scenery of the jungle to the sophistication of the metropolis, TOP HATS AND TOM-TOMS, by Elizabeth Dearmin Furbay, is the colorful, informative picture of life among the aristocratic descendants of the American Negroes, who rule the Republic of Liberia, a remote little country situated on the "Grain" coast of Africa.

For three years Mrs. Furbay lived in Monrovia, Liberia's capital, where her husband served as head of the College of West Africa, and where she came in close contact with every class of resident, from top government official to bush-native cannibal. Because of the proximity of the Hinterland—the bush country, inhabited by tribal peoples, Mrs. Furbay was able to gather some fascinating material about the Ju-Ju, the Devil Bush, and the incantations of the witch doctor, which, as she so aptly describes it, "sway the top-hatted aristocrat as well as the native."
