BABY'S day

How about Vitamin for baby? Well, they're certainly a fascinating subject! While some very serious diseases, such as rickets and scurvy, result from vitamin deficiencies, mothers today have more cause to be interested in milder vitamin deficiencies — borderline cases. Watch first for a lack of vigor and vitality in baby — it may be caused by nutritional inadequacies. This can come either from insufficient food — or from food that while sufficient in amount is poorly chosen. Such young ones may have a whole train of troubles that are not readily defined — colds, easy infection — poor teeth, rapid fatigue, retarded growth or poor appetite are some of the signs.

Fortunately most babies are not in this class, but it seems a shame that any baby should be handicapped by inadequate food. There are so many easy ways of getting a nutritious variety for babies. For instance, many doctors are now recommending a two-cereal idea — serving cereal food at one feeding, and strained oatmeal at the next. FLORIDA JURY FAILS TO INDICT IN KILLING OF BOY, 15, BY THREE WHITES

New York.—Governor S. L. Holland, of Florida, has informed the NAACP that the grand jury of Suwannee county has failed to return an indictment in the case involving the death of Willie James Howard on January 2, 1944, at Live Oak, Fla. The father of the boy was the only eye witness to the crime, other than the persons who were accused, who testified before the grand jury. The Acting State Attorney, David Lanier told the grand jury that the parties were guilty of murder in the first degree if they were guilty of anything. Willie James Howard was 15 years old at the time of his death. According to his father, three men kidnapped the boy and took him and his father in an automobile to the Suwannee River where they parked the car, tied the boy's hands and feet and threw the boy into the river. The men claimed that Willie had given the daughter of one of the men a Christmas card. They also said that Willie crawled over and fell into the river. A few days after this event, the Howards sold their house and moved to Orlando.

DEATH SENTENCES FOR 3 SOLDIERS CHANGED TO LIFE

Washington.—The death sentences of Richard P. Adams, John W. Bordenave and Lawrence Mitchell, three privates in the United States Army, who were sentenced to death on a charge of rape were commuted to life imprisonment on April 29 by President Roosevelt, it was learned here last week. The three soldiers while on guard duty in a Louisiana camp were accused of having attacked a white man within the camp grounds. They were first sentenced to death by a Louisiana state court, but NAACP lawyers took the case to the United States Supreme Court and had it thrown out on the ground that the state court had no jurisdiction. The men were then tried by court martial at Camp Maxey, Texas, where they were again sentenced to death largely because they had given numerous conflicting signed confessions to both civil and military authorities.
