Grapefruit Meringue Pie 2 egg yolks, slightly beaten Grated rind and juice of 1 cup sugar 1/2 teaspoon salt 2 cups canned

grapefruit juice Combine cornstarch, flour, sugar, and salt and mix. . . Add ½ cup grapefruit juice and mix. Add remaining grapefruit juice and cook until mixture begins to thicken; place over boiling water and cook until thick and smooth (15 minyolks, return to double boiler, and cook a few minutes longer. . . . Add orange rind and juice and cool. Pour into pie shell. . . . Top with meringue made by beating 4 table-spoons sugar gradually into 2 stiff-ly beaten egg whites. . . Bake in slow oven (325° F.) 25 minutes.

Spry Pie Shell Mix 11/4 cups sifted ALL-PURPOSE FLOUR and ½ teaspoon SALT. Measure out 7 tablespoons SPRY and divide into two equal parts. STEP 1 for Tenderness-cut in first half of Spry until as fine as meal.
