We disagree with the gentlemen who adjure us to be patient, on still another point. It is that the goal of the Negro is mere equality of opportunity. Many, perhaps most, Negroes think this the goal. We can appreciate why their eyes are fastened on the foothill ahead and why they fail to see the mountain that towers behind it. But whatever this or that Negro may think to be the goal the real goal toward which the exploited workers of all races are struggling is something vastly more exciting than equality of opportunity which, in a decadent society, might mean nothing more than "equal opportunity" in the breadlines.

The world that unfolds before us and which we struggle to reach is one wherein there is not only "equality of opportunity," but opportunity for all. This is no distinction without a difference. It is theoretically possible for Negro workers and white workers to have "equality of opportunity" under conditions where millions are unemployed and where where poverty spreads even faster than wealth accumulates.

Limitless opportunity for all—a thing that is possible as soon as enough impatient people decide to give Progress a real push—will put an end to economic dualism. And, when an end is put to economic rivalry, an end will also have been put to the primary cause of racial prejudice.

NEGRO WORKERS ARE URGENTLY NEEDED

(Continued from Page 1) sulted in urgent calls from Generals Eisenhower and MacArthur for more and more production of certain types of war equipment, Mr. Wilson said.

The greatest immediate manpower need, Mr. Wilson pointed out, is in artillery, mortar and small arms ammunition plants, forges and foundries, tire plants and cotton duck mills. Other war industries for which more workers are needed immediately to meet pressing military demands he added, are shipbuilding and naval repair yards, plants producing B-29 bombers and new fighter planes, plants making trucks and components communication wire and wire rope factories, plants building artillery and gun carriages, tanks and self-propelled guns.

RANDOLPH COMES OUT FOR THIRD PARTY

New York (CNS) A Philip Randolph, head of the Brotherhood of Sleeping Car Porters, has come out for an independent party to be organized "without delay if America is to face with assurance the difficult problems of peace and postwar reconstruction."

In a stirring article in the Common Sense Magazine, Randolph says he wants this party to stand up the Scanlon-Dawson-LaFollette Bill for a permanent FEPC. It would want the party to be clearly for a federal poll tax repeal bill and a federal anti-lynching bill and for abolition of race segregated education in border states such as Missouri and Maryland.

"It must exclude fascists and communists but such groups as the Liberal Party in New York, the Political Action Committee, the Socialist, Party and Michigan Commonwealth Federation should be urged to unite with the trade unions and liberal farm organizations in building the new party."
