WASHINGTON—More than 60% of the world's industrial production and hence potential military production, will be centered in the United States at the end of this war.

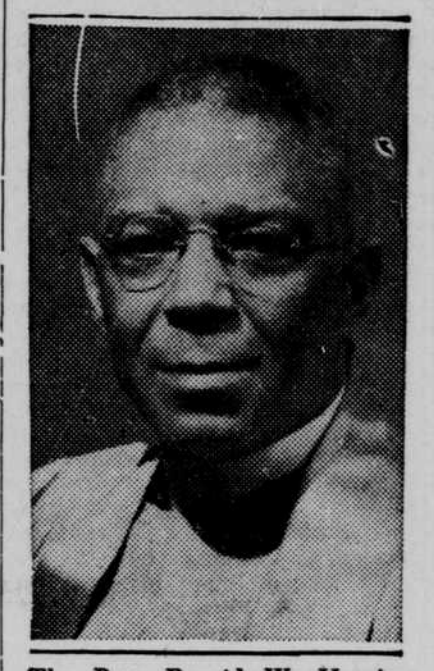

The newly appointed Archbishop of Canterbury, Geoffrey Francis Fisher, serves tea at a service dedicating seven Church Army mobile canteens for work among the armed forces. The ceremony took place in the courtyard of Fulham Palace. The Archbishop soon to be enthroned succeeded the late William Temple. He has been Bishop of London for the past five years. Previously he had been Bishop of Chester. He is 57 years old, father of six boys, four in the Army.

But it faces a "great nightmare" in the danger of encirclement by any power which might achieve control over Eurasia.  
This is one of the conclusions arrived at by William B. Ziff, military analyst and authority on international affairs, in his latest best-seller "The Gentlemen Talk of Peace."  
"If the Soviets decide to take over Europe either directly or indirectly," Ziff writes, "we would not be able to prevent it. We will not be able to prevent an absorption by China of many of the policies which have guided Japan during the current century."



The Rev. Bravid W. Harris, who has accepted his election to be Missionary Bishop of Liberia, West Africa. Mr. Harris has been in charge of Episcopal Church work with the Negro people in the United States, and soon will be consecrated to the Episcopate to lead the work of his Church in the African republic. He will be the third Negro bishop in that jurisdiction, the first, Samuel D. Ferguson, was consecrated in 1884, and the second, T. Momolu Gardiner, a native Liberian, who served as Suffragan from 1921 to 1941.

The author, whose "The Coming Battle of Germany" in 1942 is claimed to have had a direct influence on the conduct of the war, asserts that in the event of such encirclement "our nation would be to its enemies as the Poland of 1939 was to the Nazi-Soviet alliance, outnumbered, outproduced, outgunned and outflanked in every direction."  
Despite our enormous production as shown in this war, Ziff contends that "in a comparison of the mass resources by which war are waged, we could come off poorly."  
"Only by exclusive possession of the full aggregate of islands which dot the two big oceans," he writes, could we achieve a counterbalance to the overwhelming superiority of numbers, materials and strategic situation a unification of the Old World would confer. Without them profitable counterattack would be costly, painful and perhaps impossible. Their possession by an enemy would expose our production facilities and transportation centers to that methodical demolition which will be the primary task of all mil-
