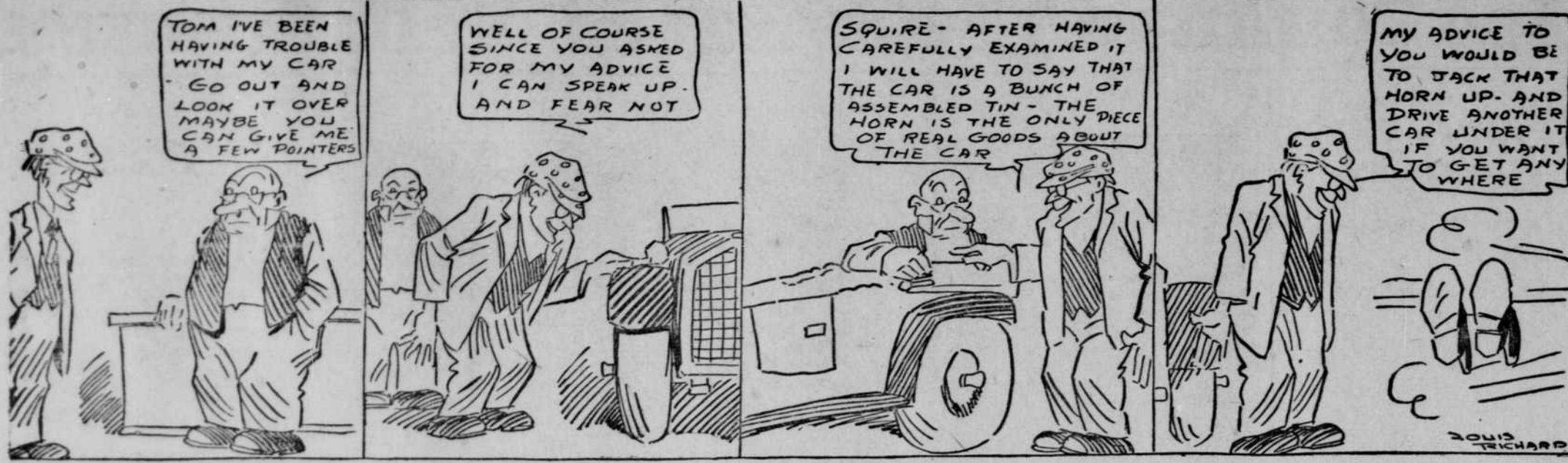

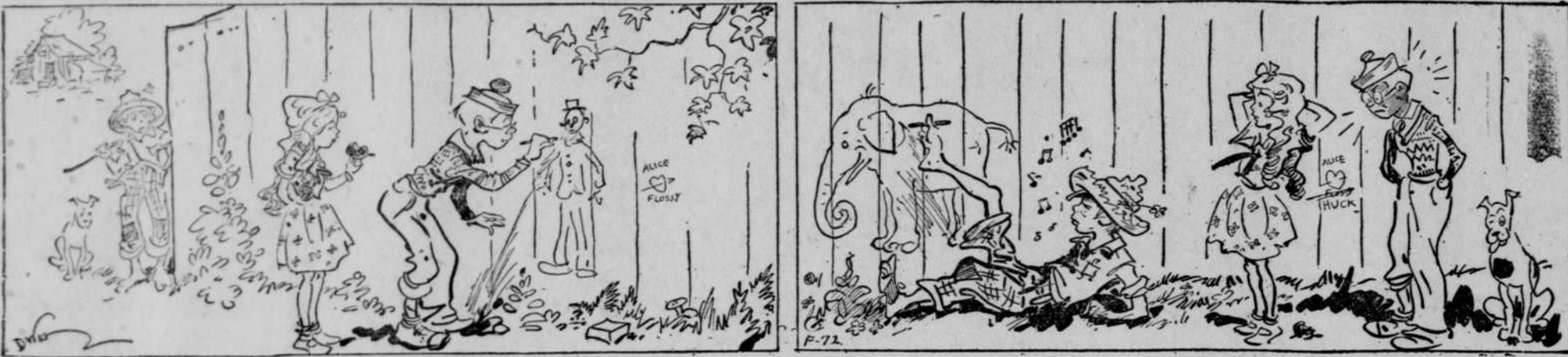

200 Red Cross Workers Now on Duty in Luzon

Washington—Two hundred American Red Cross field and hospital workers are now active in the Luzon area. Nyles I. Christensen, Director of Operations in the area, advised today. This figure is exclusive of administrative personnel, and

375 local employees.

Of the field workers, 71 task force men offer canteen and recreation service to combat troops, and every infantry division and large Army unit is served by field men. Welfare services are available at 96 field offices in combat zones, hospitals and base areas. Fifty-seven trained hospital work-

ers serve all hospitals on Luzon, except for portable units which are serviced by itinerant workers. Fifteen Civilian War Aid representatives actively support Army Civil Affairs sections in liberated areas in the Philippines. There are canteen and recreation clubs at all combat air-strips, and fourteen mobile canteens to serve

combat fliers at Clark Field. Three rest clubs for infantry troops have been established. Of the above services, the following are located in the greater Manila area: six canteens, twenty field offices, eight recreation clubs. A downtown canteen in Manila daily feeds troops on Army conducted sight-seeing tours.

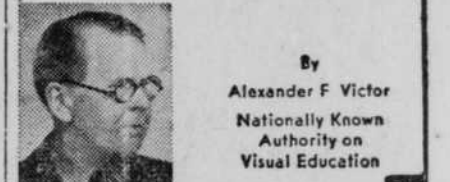
