"Everlasting Father"-the tender and loving, unfailing One to whom time brings no change, for He is the "Father of eternity." "Prince of Peace"-He is not yet the Ruler of the nations of the world, hence we hear not only of wars but of rumors of wars. Mark it well that there will

be no enduring peace until He comes to reign whose right it is to reign, the divine Prince of Peace.

III. Jesus Christ-the Light and the King (Luke 1:26-33).


