

Saint Louis, Mo., March 17 (Special) Unless the Christian forces of our country are prepared to send legions of loyal, Christ-exalting preachers into Germany and Russia, as into China and Japan, the next generation of Americans may hove to send expeditionary forces across the oceans,

> far larger than the ten million plus called to the colors during the Second World War. This prediction was made here today by Dr. Walter A. Maier, Professor at Concordia Seminary, Saint Louis, who spoke from the Graham Memorial Chapel of Washington University in the international broadcast of the Lutheran Hour.

Dr. Maier further stated: "Even we in the United States may have to crawl into the ground and into the clefts of the rocks to avoid destruction by atomic Lombs, the

secrets of which have been stolen and the power of which can now be multiplied a thousand times over the first and fearsome models that rained ruin from the japanese skies.
