Ice Cream Dolls Are Sure To Reign As Belles At A Party



ICE cream dolls are sure to rate as belles at a party for the younger crowd. It's no trouble to serve this glamorous dessert treat as a highlight to refreshments if you make ice cream with sweetened condensed milk. Crunchy cookies, too, for collars and hats, can be made with magic speed with sweetened condensed milk, and without making inroads on your supply of sugar, eggs, flour or shortening. These thrifty treats are guaranteed failure-proof, so you can let the teen agers make their own party supplies. When it's time to assemble the dolls, place a cookie on each plate, add a ball of ice cream, top it with another cookie, and stick raisins in place for eyes, nose and mouth.

With an assortment of different kinds of games, such as Make a Million, Camelot, and Monopoly, the entertainment part of the party will take care of itself.

Sweetened condensed milk used as an ice cream mix guarantees a creamy, smooth texture, free of ice crystals. Just three ingredients are called for besides the sweetened condensed milk—thin cream or evaporated milk, flavoring and water. If whipping cream is available, you can substitute a cup of it, whipped, for the thin cream or evaporated milk.

If raisins are hard to find for the dolls' eyes, currants, small bits of dates or prunes, or halves of cherries may be used instead. A small lace paper dolly under the lower cookie serves as a most becoming lace collar.

Magic Vanilla Ice Cream (Automatic Refrigerator Method)
1/2 cup sweetened condensed milk
1/2 cup water
1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla
1 cup chilled light cream or evaporated milk

Mix sweetened condensed milk, water, and vanilla. Chill. Add cream or evaporated milk. Mix well. Freeze rapidly in freezing unit of refrigerator until half frozen. Scrape from freezing tray into chilled bowl. Beat until smooth but not melted. Replace in freezing unit. Before mixture is completely frozen, beat again until smooth. Finish freezing. Serves 5.

Magic Five-Way Cookies
1 1/2 cups (15 oz. can)
1/2 cup peanut butter
Any one of these 5 ingredients
(1) 2 cups raisins
(2) 2 cups corn flakes
(3) 2 cups bran flakes
(4) 1 cup chopped nut meats
(5) 2 cups chopped dates

Mix sweetened condensed milk, peanut butter, and any one of the five ingredients listed; drop by spoonfuls on greased baking sheet. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) 15 minutes, or until done. Remove from pan at once. Makes about 30 cookies.



15-STORY "TEST TUBE" DESIGNED BY FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT



A fifteen-story glass tower, designed by the famous architect, Frank Lloyd Wright, is the feature of a modern wax research laboratory to be built this year in Racine, Wisconsin. It was announced today by Herbert F. Johnson, Jr., president of S. C. Johnson & Son, Inc., of Racine, Johnson said: "Our new building, which will mark the 60th anniversary of the founding of our business, will be a companion to the Johnson Administration Building which was also designed by Wright and completed in 1939. It will give us unsurpassed facilities for the development of better wax products for home and industry, and at the same time represent, I believe, as great a contribution to business architecture as did our first Wright building." The new Johnson's Wax laboratory is a compact, tall stack, rising 156 feet in the air, serviced directly from a circular masonry stem connected to floors at the center of each of the fifteen levels that make up the building. Each level is to be brilliant with sunlight in every part and air conditioned, heated, serviced complete from the central shaft. Wright believes that the new Johnson Research Building will prove an inspiring example for American business—"inspiring business to make itself more effective by making itself more presentable."
