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

An excellent example of the kind of quackery many of us are ready to accept can be found in the obesity cures. Obesity cure fakers literally live off the fat of the land, wisely observed the American Medical Assn. Yet nostrums for losing weight still flood the market and will so long as the buxom beauty is out of style. The obesity cure advertisements usually contain a testimonial. 'I reduced 70 pounds in four months' and a picture of a woman with a shape that turns the overweight person green with envy. Usually it is stated that no exercise i

Of obesity's various causes, like over eating and lack of exercise are not inconsequential factors. Prospective purchasers of obesity nostrums would do well to beware all remedies claiming to be harmless and requiring no diet or exercise.
