We cannot tolerate anything in as stealing what belongs to another. The very commandment against stealing implies that men have a right to that which they have made. earned or saved.

If no one had any property rights there could be no stealing. Some of our modern political and social isms dany such rights, but their reasoning is clearly not biblical or Chris-

"Thou shalt not steal," forbids every kind of theft, and this includes more than robbery or ordinary stealing (see Lev. 19:11-13).

It relates to every kind of false dealing with another, such as oppression or the withholding of just wages. That, too, is stealing in
