

Springarn Medal Award Nomination Open

NEW YORK, Oct. 17th—Nominations for the Springarn Medal are now open. Walter White announced today. The award was instituted by the late J. E. Springarn (then chairman of the board of directors of the NAACP) who gave annually, until his death in 1939 a gold medal to the American Negro who had made the highest or noblest achievement during the preceding year or years in any honorable field of human endeavor. The choice is not limited to any one field, whether of intellectual, spiritual, physical, scientific, artistic, commercial, educational, or other endeavor, but is presented by the Committee of Award, consisting of nine persons selected by the NAACP board of directors, to the person whose particular act or achievement deserves

the highest acclaim. The award is usually presented to the winner at the NAACP annual Conference, when a presentation speech is delivered by a distinguished citizen. Springarn Medalist for 1946 was Thurgood Marshall for his distinguished service as a lawyer before the Supreme Court of the United States and inferior courts, particularly in the Texas Primary Case which conceivably may have more far reaching influence than any other act in the ending of disfranchisement based upon race or color in the country; also in recognition of the unselfishness and courage that he showed not only in this but in other cases for the right of Negroes to belong to trade unions, in his attack upon the Jim Crow travel system and unequal educational opportunities, and for his

human rights and justice in the courts. Other previous winners of the award have included Paul Robeson, Judge William H. Hastie, Richard Wright; Charles R. Drew; Marian Anderson; James Weldon Johnson and Walter White. Recommendations for the award should be submitted in writing to the Secretary of the Committee of Award, 20 West 40th St., New York City by January 1. Such communications should tell in detail the achievement of the person recommended as meriting the Springarn Medal.

Exhibition Of Latin American Drawings

An exhibition entitled LATIN AMERICAN DRAWINGS, will be on view at the Joslyn Memorial, Omaha, November 15th through December 1st. This exhibition has been organized by the Council for Inter-American Cooperation under a grant from the Department of State. It consists of recent drawings by a proximately forty artists from the following countries: Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Brazil, Cuba, Ecuador, Mexico and Venezuela. Among the artists represented are: Jose Clemente Orozco; Alfredo Zalce, and Guillermo de Mexico; Mario Carreno; Luis Martinez Pedro, and Amelia Pelaez of Cuba; Candido Portinari, Lasar; Rodolfo Castagna of Argentina; and many others.

The lenders include: The United States Department of State; The Library of Congress; The Museum of Modern Art; The San Francisco Museum of Art; Mr. and Mrs. Frederick W. Beckman; Mr. Edgar J. Kaufmann, Jr.; M. Knoedler and Company; Perls Galleries; Fleemann Galleries; Hugo Gallery; Pierre Matisse Gallery; Arnold Seligmann; Rey and Company and others. The exhibition is the first of its kind ever assembled for circulation throughout the United States. Most of the drawings have never been shown before, and many were made especially for inclusion in the show. Roberto Berdolet's "Ector Polo's", and Francisco Domamantes' among them. No attempt has been made to present a complete survey of contemporary Latin American drawings. Instead, the emphasis has been on a summary presentation of the major trends and styles existing in several of the leading art centers.

Preparatory sketches for mural and oil paintings, studies from life as well as finished drawings form the exhibition. Pencil, pen and ink charcoal, and crayon drawings are included. The exhibition was assembled by the Council at the request of the Museum of Cranbrook Academy of Art, Bloomfield Hills, Michigan where it was on view during the month of July. The itinerary also includes the following museums: William Rockhill Nelson Gallery of Art, Kansas City; San Francisco Museum of Art; Cleveland Museum of Art; Joslyn Memorial, Omaha; Wadsworth Atheneum, Hartford; and Institute of Modern Art, Boston. The Council for Inter-American Cooperation conducts a program of Latin American circulating under a grant from the Department of State. Exhibitions now touring the country include: Six Latin American Painters and one-man shows by Frederico Cantu an Antonio Sotomayor and, of course, Pedro Figari.

WALTER WHITE TO WRITE COLUMN FOR DAILY PAPER

A "first" in the history of newspaper publishing in the United States was achieved with the initial publication this month by mass circulation newspapers of a weekly column by an American Negro leader, Walter White, secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. Participating in this trail-blazing event were representative newspapers with a combined total circulation in excess of 2,500,000 daily. They were the New York HERALD-TRIBUNE; the Akron BEACON JOURNAL; the Philadelphia EVENING BULLETIN; the Chicago DAILY NEWS; the Detroit FREE PRESS; the Newark STAR-JOURNAL; the Trenton TIMES; and the Mansfield (Ohio) NEWS JOURNAL.

The Walter White column is under consideration by a number of other publishers who are awaiting public reaction in its initial appearance. Originally projected as a thrice-weekly commentary on the news of the day with special emphasis on the field of race relations, the newsprint shortage, which has caused many newspapers to throw out advertising and severely curtailed the amount of space they were able to devote to features, has made necessary the change to once-a-week.

In the current column, White writes on "The Negro Vote" and sees no perceptible drift back to the GOP. He concludes that "the present temper of Negro voters is to ignore party labels completely and to vote independently on the records of the candidates."

City Improvement Plan Is Progressive Movement

Omahaans who have long turned their noses up at the city's dusty, creaking auditorium will have a chance to do something about it at the November 5 election. E. F. (Gene) Agee, general chairman of the City-Wide Improvement Plan today pointed out that a bond issue of \$3,540,000 for a big and modern auditorium is a leading issue among the 14 improvement projects to be voted upon.

Objective of the improvement program is to develop Omaha into one of the nation's progressive cities. The City-Wide Improvement Plan committee recommended that the new auditorium should be an all-purpose building," said Mr. Agee. It should be air conditioned and there must be ample seating space available for use not only while the auditorium itself is in use but for public parking day or night, which would make it possible to secure additional revenue. Mr. Agee said that the committee believes that a properly operated auditorium not only would pay all of its operating expenses but it also would produce a sufficient surplus to take care of improvements and upkeep. The proposed city center, roughly governing the area between the post office building and the Joslyn Memorial, has been deemed the logical site for a new auditorium.

"Voters must also decide by special ballot if they wish to have the proposed auditorium governed by a non-partisan commission to supervise the carrying out of the project. A second improvement project to be put to vote is the proposed construction of an \$185,000 naval armory.

The proposal developed following an announcement of the navy plan to train in this area a reserve force adequate to man one ship.

It is expected that the naval reserve will produce for Omaha an annual payroll of from \$250,000 to \$300,000, representing the pay for permanent naval officers in charge and the salaries of an estimated 1000 local participants. Mr. Agee declared that the type structure required to serve the navy will be so designed and constructed as to include a drill hall and gymnasium, shops, school rooms, movie projection room, offices, and lockers and gunnery facilities. Voters To Choose Between Mixed and Pure Natural Gas

Manufactured Gas is not involved in Election, MUD Officials State

In a statement released this week officials of the Metropolitan Utilities District emphasized that Omaha citizens will NOT be deciding whether the city is to have manufactured or Natural Gas in the future. They point out that regardless of the election outcome Omaha will be forced to change from 50 percent to 75 percent Natural Gas next summer, in order to meet the urgent demands for more gas. The choice is between 75 percent Natural Gas or straight Natural Gas.

The Utilities District had to curtail all new installations of gas heating this summer because the present gas plant capacity had been reached. Omaha is now using a 80 percent mixture of Natural Gas, and this mixture must be increased to 75 percent if voters do not approve full Natural Gas November 5th, the statement says.

As a engineering authorities have advised the city that a 75 percent mixture would be only a temporary measure and that within a few years Omaha would have no choice but to go to full Natural Gas service. Putting off the decision to go to full Natural Gas would practically double the changeover expense.

The statement says that "Approving full, 100 percent Natural Gas now will assure abundant gas at lowest cost, for all purposes in the future and will avoid further inconvenience, expense and difficulty as Omaha's gas demands increase through the years". District officials fear that the small Natural Gas ballot may be lost or ignored by voters among the stack of ballots that will be handed them at the polls November. For this reason, the District is publishing pictures of the ballot and its text in the various newspapers published and circulated in Omaha, in an effort to familiarize citizens with the appearance of the Natural Gas proposal and its significance.

"We expect this movement to expand to become the most powerful liberal or progressive organization ever brought together in the history of this country". He announced that Jack Kroll, C. B. Baldwin, Walter White, A. F. Whitney, Jo Davidson, Clark Foreman and James Patton, president of the National Farmers Union would comprise the Nomination Committee with Kroll acting as chairman.
