4 cups or 1 lb. cranberries

1 medium-size orange 1 cup mild-flavored honey

Wash cranberries and orange: remove blemishes. Peel orange, remove white membrane from rind and seeds from pulp. Grind cranberries, orange rind and pulp in food chopper, using medium knife. Pour honey over the fruit, stir to blend. Fill sterilized pint jars. Let stand 24 hours before using to develop flavor. Makes about 2 pints relish.

### Carol Drake's favorite Christmas cookies

A full cooky jar adds much to the enjoyment of the holiday season. These cookies will make pleasant snacking for droppers-in or for the family.

CHOCOLATE NUT COOKIES

This luscious mouthful is a cross between a cooky and a candy. The recipe uses no sugar.

3 one-oz. squares unsweetened 1/2 cup chopped chocolate walnut meats Walnut halves 1 fifteen-oz. can sweetened condensed (not

evaporated) milk Melt chocolate over hot water; add condensed milk; stir until well blended; add vanilla. Stir in walnut meats; drop by 1/2-teaspoonfuls onto well-greased cooky sheet. Place walnut half on each cooky. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 10 to 12 minutes. Remove from cooky sheet to rack immediately. Makes about 5

HONEY HERMITS

Here's another sugarless cooky. Be sure to grease the cooky sheet well, for cookies containing honey tend to stick. 1/2 cup honey 11/4 cups all-1/4 cup melted purpose flour

1/4 tsp. soda shortening 1/2 cup chopped 1/2 tsp. salt raisins 1/2 tsp. cinnamon 1/2 tsp. nutmeg 1/2 cup chopped 1 egg, well beaten nut meats Sift flour and then measure into

sifter with soda, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg. Combine the egg, honey, melted shortening, raisins and nut meats, beating well. Sift the flour and spices into the honey mixture, mixing well. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto well-greased cooky sheet. Bake in a moderate oven (375° r'.) 12 to 15 minutes or until done. Makes 21/2 dozen cookies.
