NEW, DIFFERENT LENTEN DISH No dull Lenten meals for your family if you have this recipe for Halibut Supreme with Cheese Whirls. Sounds grand and tastes even better! It's golden brown, tender biscuit whirls, flecked with pimiento and parsley, baked on unusually tasty creamed fish. Start right by sautéing the green pepper and onion in a pure, all-vegetable shortening, like Spry. Dependable shortening is important, too, for the flaky cheese-biscuit topping.



HALIBUT SUPREME WITH CHEESE WHIRLS

Melt Spry in saucepan. Add green peppers and onions and cook until onions yellow. Add flour, salt, paprika, and pepper and blend. Add milk gradually, stirr constantly, and cook until thickened. Add fish and lemon juice. Keep hot when making Cheese Whirls.

. CHEESE WHIRLS

Sift flour with baking powder and salt. Cut in Spry fine. Add milk and cheese, mixing to a soft dough. Knead lightly on floured board for about 20 seconds. Roll dough into rectangle. Sprinkle pimiento and parsley over dough Roll up like jelly roll. Cut into ½ inch slices. Pour boiling hot fish mixture into oblong 10 x 6-inch baking dish and lay biscuit slices on top, cut side up. Bake in hot oven (425° F.)
