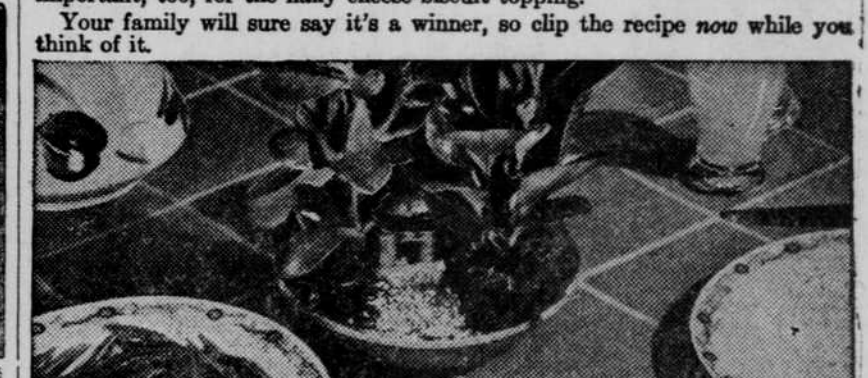

HALIBUT SUPREME WITH CHEESE WHIRLS. 1/2 cup Spry, 1/2 cup green peppers, chopped, 1/2 cup onion, sliced, 2 tablespoons flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon paprika, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, 1 1/2 cups milk, 1 1/2 pounds halibut, cooked and flaked (about 2 1/2 cups), 2 tablespoons lemon juice.
