The violation of civil rights arose when Solano County deputy sheriffs, acting on the alleged statement of unknown persons that Negroes had been seen fleeing from the scene of a murder of a Chabot Terrace grocer, entered and searched nearly 100 homes of Negro families in the housing project on May 17. A subsequent coroner's investigation failed to produce a witness who could substantiate the report that a Negro was seen at the place of the crime.

Charging the Housing Authority with responsibility, since the execu tive diretcor of the project gave pass keys to the deputy sheriffs, protests were lodged by the Vallejo branch of the NAACP, and the Chabot Interracial Club.
