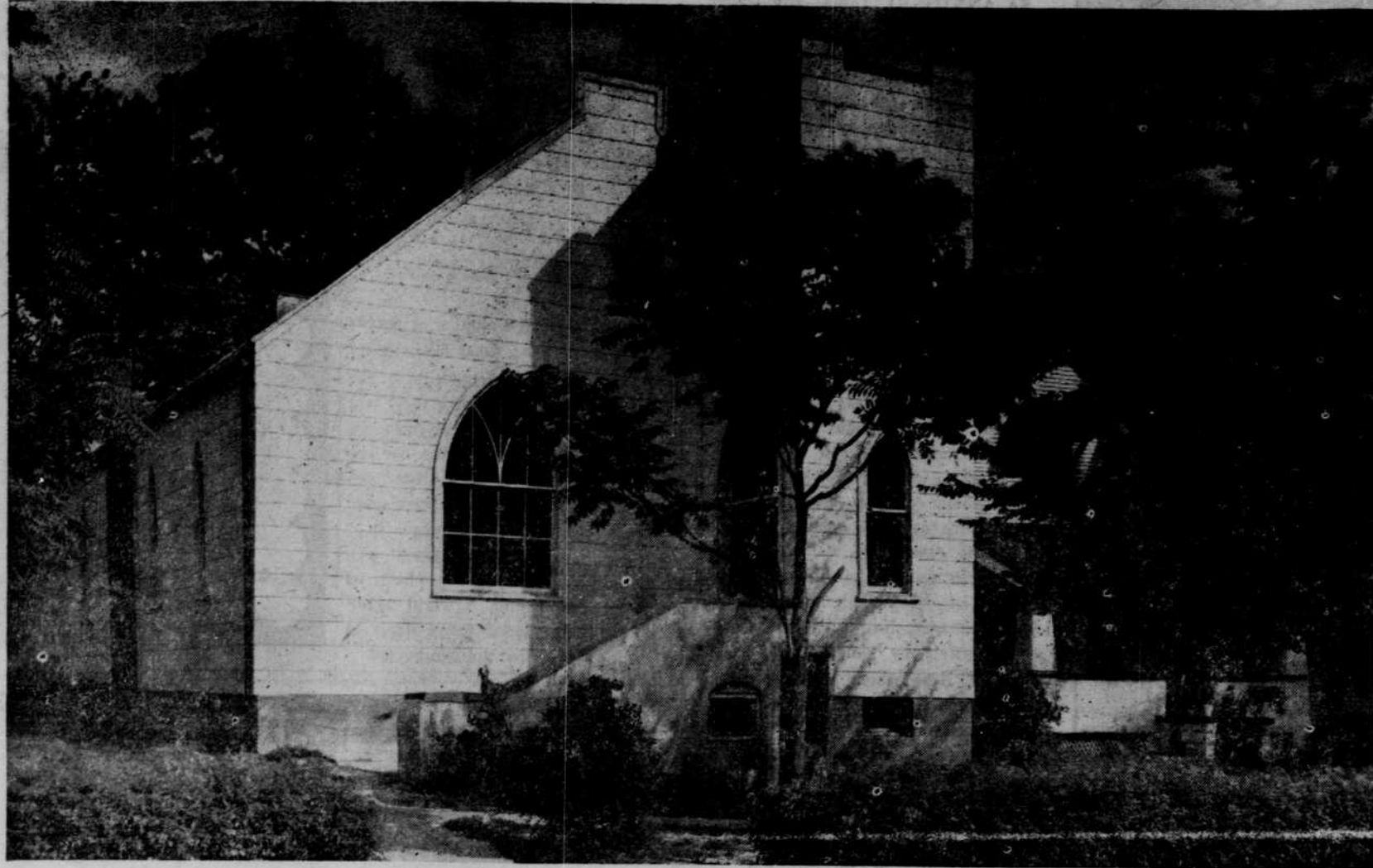


Allen Chapel A. M. E. Church And It's Very Progressive Pastor And Family

LINCOLN UNIVERSITY (MO.) ENROLLMENT CONTINUES TO SOAR

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo.—In spite of the practice which has been in vogue since the first of July of refusing to accept for admission all except students who have campus reserved living quarters, the enrollment at Lincoln University of Missouri has mounted to 1122, the highest ever in the history of the Institution.

According to an announcement by Registrar Walter R. Talbot, these figures represent the 906 students in the college of arts and sciences; 17 in the School of Journalism; 7 in the graduate division; 45 in the School of Law (St. Louis) and 147 in the Lincoln University Laboratory High school.
