Awards In Keeping With The League's Long Establihed Plan of Providing Education

The National Urban League, 1133 Broadway, New York City, has just approunced that three recent college are to receive fellowships from the Urban League for study in social work this fall. These awards, whilich include tuition and maintenance, have been granted to Frances L. Clark, Fisk University, '47; Thomas Augustine, Oberlin College and Columbia University, '47; and Josephine Belle, Upsala College, '47.

Miss Clark, a resident of Nashville, Tennessee, will study in the New York School of Social Work, Columbia University, while Mr. Augustine of East Orange, New Jersey and Miss Bell of Montclair, New Jersey, will study in the Graduate Departments of Sociology and Economics at the University of Pittsburgh, Miss Clark a special fund provided by income donated by friends of the late Ella Skinner Honored Sachs Plotz; Mr. Augustine's maintenance is to be provided jointly by the Pittsburgh and National Urban Leagues, and Miss Belle's maintanance is provided by the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs.


