ABC will produce five major documentary programs this year. Domestic social conditions will be one... NBC conductor Arturo Toscanini returns to the podium of the NBC Symphony Ork (Sat-6:30 PM)... Eddie Green, Eddie the Waiter of the "Duffy's Tavern" show (NBC-Weds-9 PM) is also an amateur radio bug, having built himself a television set... The Charioteers are set for a guest shot on Jack Smith's show (CBS-Mon-7:15 PM).

SHOW TIME:
Singers Paul Robeson, Lena Horne and Josh White were recent guests on MBS Commentator Arthur Gaeth's show reporting on contributions made by Negroes to American civilization... The National Conference of Christians and Jews has made its fourth annual radio awards. Recipients: CBS' "Liberty Road"; MBS' "Exploring the Unknown"; ABC's "Greatest Story Ever Told"; and the New York independent WNEW's "Little Songs" series... Stage and screen actor Canada Lee was at home in the lead role of a prize fighter on NBC's "Mystery Theatre" (Fri-10 PM)... FBI Chief J. Edgar Hoover said last week that radio cannot be blamed for juvenile delinquency, but can be used as a powerful weapon in eradicating it.

Platinum Foxes Possible
By depriving ordinary silver foxes of one of the "B" group of vitamins, it is possible to obtain a platinum fox. This discovery was made at University of California. However, the platinum foxes do not produce furs so durable as the Norwegian variety. The only fox that is being raised commercially to any great extent in the United States is the silver fox. Perhaps they lend themselves to confinement better than most wild animals. The grey fox is much slower than the red fox. The red fox has been known to cover a given distance at the rate of 30 miles per hour.

Nature of Wool
What is wool? It is the hair of the sheep, an animal fiber, a protein substance. It ranks topmost in its field and its varied utilization in the wearing apparel industry is so great as to assure its pre-eminence in the manufacture of both smart and utility clothing, especially where protection from cold is essential. There are substitutes for wool, one of the most successful being Lanital, an artificial fiber made in Italy in 1936. Another, produced in the United States in 1940, is called Aralac. Both substitutes are made from casein, a product of skimmed milk.
