WALLACE FOR PRESIDENT COM.

Twenty-eight Negro leaders have been named to the National Wallace for President Committee which will meet in Chicago, April 10 to 12, to draft plans for a national new political party. The committee is headed by former Gov. Elmer A. Benson of Minnesota and has Paul Robeson as one of five co-chairmen.

Plans for carrying Henry Wallace's program, which includes the outlawing of racial discrimination and segregation in any form, to the people of America will be drawn up at the national conference," C. B. Baldwin, campaign manager for Wallace, said. Wallace, who had declared that "until discrimination in

any form is abolished our use of the word "democracy" will ring hollow throughout the world," is backing a detailed program of civil rights for the Negroes and other minorities.

The program includes a permanent FEPC, federal anti-lynching and anti-poll tax laws, federal inspection of polling places where rights of Negroes to vote are blocked, federal and state legislation to outlaw discrimination and segregation in government service, including the armed forces.

TRAFFIC NEWS

Nebraska State Safety Patrol Safer driving habits on the part of Nebraska drivers can pay off as is evidenced by the fact that insurance rates on private passenger cars were reduced by many companies March 22nd, the Nebraska State Safety Council advised this paper today.

Dwight Havens, President of the Council, announced he had learned that the National Bureau of Casualty Companies had reduced the insurance rates applicable to private passenger cars on the average of 6.1 per cent for bodily injury and 14.7 per cent for property liability insurance. So far, Nebraska is the only state receiving such a reduction. This will mean a saving of approximately \$680,000 to Nebraska policyholders.

"Our continued efforts to be safer drivers can pay off to an even greater extent in the future," Havens said. "If Nebraska attains its goal of saving 100 lives in '48 with resultant decrease in accidents, our insurance rates could be reduced even further, and let us not overlook the resultant saving in human suffering which accompanies every accident," Havens concluded.

Good Government Sunday The President of the Omaha Council of Churches, Mr. Fred P. Curtis, today requested the churches of Omaha to observe Sunday, April 4, as "Good Government Sunday."

The appeal was the result of a unanimous action of the executive committee of the Council of Churches upon recommendation of its Social Education and Action Committee. "A good Christian must also be a good citizen," said Mr. Curtis. "To have good government, people must register to vote. They must vote for public officials of high moral character, who will put common welfare above selfish interest, who will control vice, and who will be leaders in civic betterment."

He urged that churches emphasize the duties of citizenship as a minimum necessity for good government. "It is of utmost importance that the candidates for public office shall be nominated in the Primary on April 13 by our best citizens. The Primary vote has often run as light as 15,000 or 20,000," he said.

The president of the church organization said that 50,000 printed folders would be distributed through the churches next Sunday by the Omaha Council of Churches urging that "A good citizen wants and insists on good government." He congratulated the churches on the excellent emphasis which has been given by them to the necessity for registering before April 2nd.

The Omaha Council of Churches is a voluntary association of churches through which 77 local churches of 22 denominations cooperate.
