"A total of 3247 Nebraska drivers have lost their licenses since the first of the year, thru the Safety Responsibility Act of 1945, for failure to report their accident or to furnish the proof of their financial responsibility."

Boyles assured Nebraskans that the intent of the Legislature was to strike at the irresponsible driver and the reckless person who does not have the funds nor carry insurance enough to be financially able to pay for damage inflicted by himself in case of an accident.

Boyles, however, did state that the act also affects the driver who may be the best and the safest on the highway. In case of accident, with property damage of over \$50.00, both parties are required to submit an accident report to the Motor Vehicle Division of the Department of Roads and Irrigation within 10 days after the accident.
