Pursuant to the provisions of L. B. 330 of the Sixty-Seventh Session of the Legislature of Nebraska, notice is hereby given to each of you that you may vote at a referendum upon the following question:

"Shall service in positions shatt service in positions covered by the Nebraska School Retirement System be covered by the Social Security Act?"

To be eligible to vote in such referendum, you must be employed in a position covered by the School Retirement System and be a member of it, and you must have been employed in such position on the date of this

Ballots will be available to employees of Class I School Districts on December 17, 1955, at the offices of the county superintendents of the county super-intendents of the counties in which such districts are located. Ballots will be available to em-ployees of Class II, Class III, Class IV, and Class VI School Districts on December 16, 1955, at the office of the superintendent of schools in such districts. An absent or disabled voter will, upon application in advance to his county superintendent or superintendent of the school in which he is employed, as the case may be, be sent an absent voter's ballot.

Voters will mark ballots according to specific instructions pro-vided therewith and mail said ballots to the Supervisor of Social Security Referendum, Room 2311, State Capitol Building, Lincoln 9, Nebraska. Ballots to be counted must be postmarked prior to midnight December 17, 1955.


