

Since the passage of the Reserve Forces Act on August 9, there has been considerable interest in the new status of high school boys with regard to service in the Armed Forces. To help you understand

What is this new Reserve Forces Act?

In general it requires that all men entering the Armed Forces also take part in the Reserves. It was passed by Congress and became the law of the land in August, 1955.

What does it mean to me?

For one thing it can mean you may have more control over the time when military training takes place in your life.

How does it work?

There are some provisions for draft deferment in this act. Learn about them in detail by sending in the coupon.

How many years of Reserve service are required of me?

It can vary. It depends upon the plan you select. Again, write for complete information based upon your own circumstances.

Will I be able to finish high school? Yes.
