## Plans Are Shaping Up For United Nations Sunday

**SPECIAL GUESTS** at the "United Nations Sunday" Celebration will include many representatives of foreign countries, governmental officials, the Armed Services and civilian organizations.

The observance is being sponsored by the United Veterans Council of Omaha.

A "CAR PARADE", with convertible-type automobiles, will carry the foreign-born representatives from the corner of 17th and Chicago Streets, leaving at 1:45 P.M. to World War II Memorial Park, 60 and Dodge Streets.

**NATIVE COSTUMES** will be worn by many representatives from other nations, and the cars bearing them will be marked with the name of the native land.

**THE PROGRAM** will include a concert, beginning at 2:30 P.M. by the Strategic Air Command "S. A. C." Band, under the direction of 1st Lt. Ernest W. Geer. The formal ceremony will open

at 3:00 P.M. (not 3:30, as previously stated.) This will include an address by Col. C. Sweeney, (former Chief of Nebraska Military District, and former head of a Mission of the Russian Army).

Also, there will be brief greetings from representatives present; prayers by former service chaplains, Rev. George Kempher, and Rev. Dr. Earle Conover, as well as Rabbi Myer S. Kripke.

**IN CASE OF BAD WEATHER** Entrance to Memorial Park, by cars, is from the north, on Underwood Avenue at 57th Street. (Please, no parking of cars on the grass.)

In case of inclement weather, the ceremony will be held in the auditorium of Omaha University, 60th and Dodge Streets, just across from the park.

**FOREIGN DRESS INVITED** All foreign-born residents who have foreign clothing are urged to wear it, or even parts of such

native dress, to distinguish them as coming from abroad. Those born in other countries, not yet contacted directly to represent any other nation, are urged to contact at once Major Earle Conover, Webster 6035.

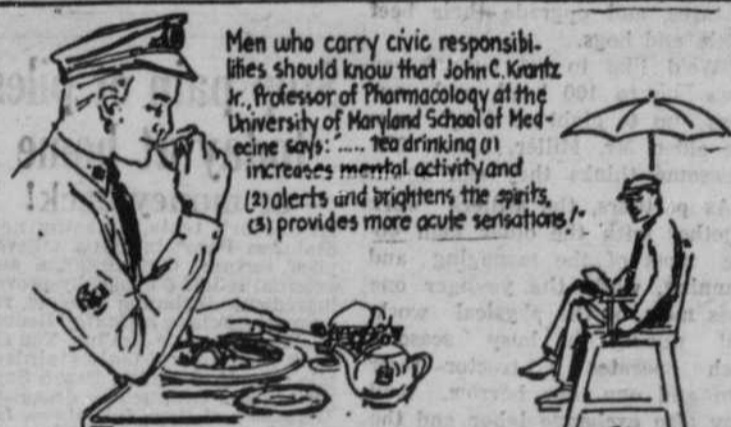

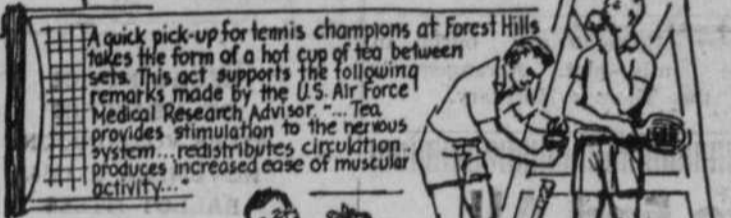

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Walls Completed Fast

**DECORATED** walls for a new attic room or other addition to the home can be achieved in short order by applying prefabricated hardboard planks over the simple backing of furring strips on open studs.

For Masonite planks, sufficient support is provided by 1" x 4" furring strips nailed horizontally



on 16" centers - a backing that is easier and quicker to fit and install than many other types. The planks are secured with special metal clips that are nailed into the furring and hidden inside tongue-and-groove joints.

When the paneling is applied over a masonry wall or over an old wall that is not solid, it is advisable to use such furring strips as a base.

For a furred base for a companion product, 16" square tongue-and-groove blocks, on walls, horizontal strips of 1" x 2" stock on 8" centers are recommended.

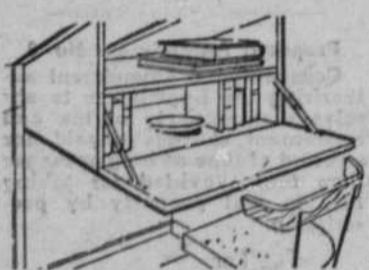
Because this paneling comes decorated in plain colors and wood grains, no finishing is necessary. With baked plastic finish fused to a Masonite tempered hardboard base, the panels are durable and easily damp-wiped clean.



Remember Desk in Attic

**IN MODERNIZING** an attic, don't forget the advantages of a built-in desk, like the one shown in the illustration. Construction is simple, but the framing should be installed before covering the rafters with panels.

Actually, this is a desk plus two storage shelves. The door may be made the same height as



the space between the shelves or it may extend above the top shelf. In the latter case, you'll protect the contents of the shelf and have a larger writing surface.

Both the desk door and the shelves are made similarly, by forming frameworks of 1 by 2-inch lumber, fastening them together with corrugated metal, and gluing Masonite 3/16" Tempered Presswood to both sides.

A permanent material for covering attic rafters is Masonite Panelwood, a hardboard that's easy to work, quick to install and long lasting. Available at lumber yards, it comes in 4 by 8-foot panels which go up in a hurry with a minimum of fuss and muss.

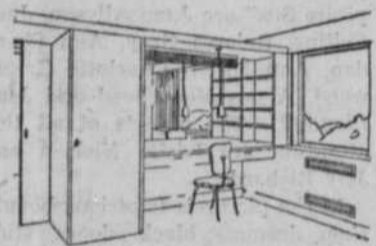

A Room for Two Children

**WHEN** two youngsters occupy the same room, ordinarily they have little privacy. However, by using a bit of imagination and ingenuity, the fix-it-themself family can create a room that has two of everything, plus built-in privacy.

First, the room is divided by means of an extra-wide divider desk and closets. This way, there'll be a separate study and clothes



storage area for each child. The separation of the space is completed by a sliding door.

Other features may include a radiator enclosure, fluorescent lighting, spacious drawers in the desks and an attractive soffit. Use of Masonite hardboards for the closet walls, desks, soffit and as underlayment for the flexible floor covering makes such a room improvement both economical and easy. A large variety of hardboards for these purposes are available at lumber yards.

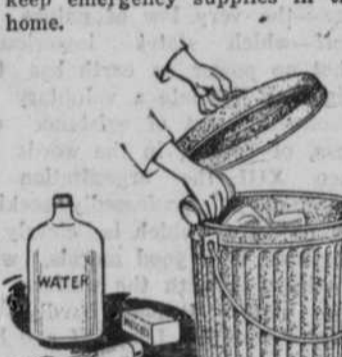
Hardboards made by Masonite Corporation, the pioneer producer, are made by exploding clean wood chips in huge guns and then compressing the fibers into thin, strong panels under extreme heat and pressure. Being all wood, these panels may be worked and finished like wood.

Emergency Supplies

**FOOD, water and light** are often shut off to families whose homes have been damaged by floods, fires or other disasters. In the event of an enemy air attack, these essentials of life would pose problems for all people in the area. The answer is to keep emergency supplies in the home.



A convenient and safe way to store the supplies is to use covered galvanized steel cans or pails. These containers are available in several sizes, so there is one to fit the space needs of every family. They are strong and durable, so fire, moisture and rodents cannot destroy supplies kept in them.

Items stored in the containers should include bottled water, canned foods, flashlights, candles and matches. These are basic emergency supplies.

A family which is isolated from its neighbors might also elect to keep a portable battery-powered radio and extra clothing among the emergency supplies, even though this may require using more than one covered metal storage can.

An important point is to keep the emergency cans of materials where they can be reached quickly and easily.
