Nation Is Racing Polio In Vaccine Program

An emergency mass vaccination program against polio is under way today in thousands of communities across the country in a race to beat the crippling 1957 deadline.

The emergency note was given the program as latest statistics show that 58,000,000 persons under 40—potential victims of the disease—were still without any protection at all.

The call to action was made by the American Medical Association, the National Medical Association, the U. S. Public Health Service and the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis. These organizations have mapped out advisory procedures in bringing millions more under the vaccine's defenses.

The methods call for inoculations both in the offices of private physicians and in public clinics, depending on local planning across the country.

Officials of the National Medical Association recently urged state, city and county medical societies to take the leadership in the mass vaccination drive. Dr. T. R. M. Howard, Chicago, Illinois, president of the National Medical Association, stated: "The 5,000 members of the N.M.A. are urging all people to get their Salk polio vaccine in the offices of their physicians. Some 51,000,000 adults and children already have started the recommended three shot series."

'Cancer Link Now Certain'

Atlanta, Ga. (AP)—The Atlanta Constitution said Friday in a copyrighted story that a scientific study group has found that cigarette smoking "beyond a reasonable doubt is a causative factor in the rapidly increasing incidence" of lung cancer.

The newspaper said it had obtained exclusively a "highly-confidential and not yet officially released" copy of the report which, it said, "establishes the most positive cause-effect link between cigarette smoking and lung cancer by a scientific group to date."

Not Yet Approved The scientific study group was set up by the American Cancer Society, the National Cancer Institute, the American Heart Association and the National Heart Institute, and was made up of seven scientists, including Dr. Rolla E.

Dyer, director of research at Atlanta's Emory University. The paper said the organizations which set up the study group have not yet approved the report.

"It is possible there will be minor changes before the report is leased, but the scientific findings have been established," the paper said.

Higher Incidence The scientists found no convincing evidence that smoking is a cause of heart disease, however, the paper added.

The report stated: "Lung cancer occurs much more frequently (five to 15 times) among cigarette smokers than among non-smokers, and there is a direct relationship between the incidence of lung cancer and the amount smoked."

"It is estimated that on a lifetime basis, one of every 10 men who smoke over two packs a day will die of lung cancer. The comparable risk among non-smokers is one out of 275."
