In the matter of the application of H. G. Clark, to have certain real estate taxes stricken from the tax list, assessed against the south half of the south west quarter, and the northwest quarter of the northeast quarter, in section 11, township 18, range 22, for the reason that said land was government land at the time it was assessed, for the years 1894 5 6 and 7, the committee recommends that said taxes for said years be stricken from the tax list.

In the matter of the application of Laura Shannon, to have certain real estate taxes stricken from the tax list, assessed against lots 1 and 3, in 18-17 for 1898, for the reason that said land was government land, at the time said land was assessed. It was moved by Cooney, seconded by Arthur, that the county clerk make a township levy of one mill on road fund; two mills on bridge fund, and two mills on general fund for West Union township; also for Myrtle township. Motion was carried, and the county clerk was instructed to enter same on tax.

Resolution by Cooney seconded by Arthur:

Whereas, The county is paying \$42.00 for water at the court house, but has no water for the yard, and at the rates we pay now, it would be a great saving to the county to put down a well with wind mill and tank, before the first day of January, 1899. Therefore be it, Resolved, by this board, and the chairman of this board is hereby instructed to have said well wind mill and tank put on court house block.

Moved and carried that the resolution be accepted and adopted.

The chairman called Supervisor Cooney to the chair, for the purpose of introducing a resolution to have county treasurer proceed at once to collect the delinquent taxes.

Resolution by Carr, seconded by Arthur:

Resolved, That, whereas, various resolutions have been passed, ordering and directing the county treasurer on Custer county, to collect the delinquent personal taxes, and, Whereas, said delinquent taxes are being collected very slowly, and, Whereas, it appears to this board that a said delinquent taxes as by law provided and by this board directed. There fore be it.

Resolved that the county attorney be, and he is hereby ordered to serve a written demand upon said county treasurer, demanding that he at once proceed to collect said delinquent taxes, and the county attorney is hereby ordered and directed, in the event of the failure of the county treasurer to comply with said demand within a reasonable time from its service, to commence the proper legal proceeding to compel said county treasurer to collect said taxes.
