Chaplain Mailley Greeted with a Large Crowd at the Opera House.

Assaulted by the Enemy, but Came on Victorious.

at the opera house Monday night. On his arrival Monday evening he was met at the train by a number of his comrades of Company M, who took in charge and entertained him during his stay. For nearly two hours he discussed the political issues in a forcible and able manner. As the audience entered the hail, each person was handed a printed copy of a letter headed "The a anu Now," dated January 30, 1839, at Manila, written by Chaplain Mailley to Congressman Stark, in opposttion to holding the Philippines, and censuring Col. Stotsenburg for his strict discipline of the soldiers, referring to his unpopularity at that time with the regiment. Just how he would answer this unexpected attack from the foe caused no little the enemy before he was throug! with it, judging from the pale complexion of some of the leaders who lar, acknowledged the authorship of the letter, and confessed it set forth his honest convictions at the time it was written, which was prior to the beginning of the actual warfare in the Philippines.
