Supervisor's Proceedings.

Friday, June 22, 1900. The board convened at 9 a. m. with all members present.

The morning was spent in committee work, considering road petitions, examining claims for damages etc., and 12 m. the board took recess for dinner until 1:30 p. m.

The board reconvened at 1:30 p. m. with all members present. The minutes of the June 21 meeting were read, corrected and approved. The Official Road Road and Road Claims Committee made the following report:

We your committee, recommend that the petition to grant a public road signed by T. C. N. Bayhoffer et al. be laid over.

It was moved and seconded that the report of the committee be accepted. The motion was carried.

The committee also reported to order the petition signed by Jacob Coover et al., to vacate the road as described in said petition, advertised by the County clerk. It was moved and carried that the report be accepted and adopted.

We, your committee recommend that the petition signed by D. G. Bowley et al. be rejected for the reason that the road asked for is not consent road.

The Claims Committee recommended to allow the claim of B. L. Nicholas for \$30.00.

It was moved and carried to accept the and adopted as recommended.

It was moved by Mr. Lind and seconded by Mr. Nicholas, that the chairman of the poor farm and Jail Committee be instructed to take whatever steps he think best relative to Chas. Burns, now at the poor farm. The motion was carried.

Moved and carried that the board now adjourn until Tuesday, June 26, 1900.

Tuesday, June 26 1900. The County Board met in regular session pursuant to adjournment, at 2 o'clock p. m. with all members present except Mr. Nicholas. The minutes of the last session were read and approved.

Mr. S. B. Thompson appeared before the board, asking them to refund \$84.82 tax paid under protest for the reason of double assessment and that taxes have been twice paid and set fourth in his notice filed with the County Clerk of Custer county, April 14, 1900.

The Erroneous and Delinquent Tax Claims Committees reported as follows: We your committee, recommend that the claim of S. B. Thompson be rejected and the County Treasurer be ordered to distribute the money. J. F. Brechbuhl, Geo. E. Carr, com. It was moved and carried that the report of the committee be accepted and adopted as recommended.

It was moved and carried that Wm. Blair, the janitor, be released from the work of sweeping and carrying for the offices in the court house during the summer months, on account of extra work which he has to do in watering and attending to the trees and court house grounds.

Mr. C. H. Miller asked that his tax claim for 19 05 be refunded, as said sum has been twice paid under a double assessment.

The Erroneous and Delinquent Tax Claims committee, reported as follows: We, your committee, recommend that the tax claim of C. H. Miller, for taxes paid under protest in Broken Bow city, be allowed and the money, \$12 05, be refunded.

It was moved and carried that the report be accepted and adopted as recommended and to order the County Treasurer to refund the money.

The Bridge and Bridge Claims Committee reported:

We the bridge committee submit the following report to wit: We have examined the Comstock bridge across the Middle Loup river, constructed by D. A. Van Sant and recommend that said bridge be accepted. J. T. Arthur, John Cooney, G. E. Carr.

Moved and carried to accept the report and adopt it as recommended.

Adjourned to 7 p. m. Tuesday Evening, June 26, 1900. The board met at 7 p. m., all the members being present.

It was moved by Mr. Brechbuhl, and seconded by Mr. Lind that the board now consider the petition of Frank Visek et al., to vacate the Longwood bridge and roads leading thereto, and the remonstrances and other objections filed thereto, and that said petition and remonstrances be considered and acted upon by the general board. The motion was carried. Mr. J. M. Scott, appearing for the remonstrators, objected to the jurisdiction of the board at this time over this petition, on the ground that the objections and remonstrances must be first considered and disposed of, and that until such action is had on such remonstrances and objections the petition cannot properly be brought before or taken under consideration by the board.

It was moved by Mr. Arthur, and seconded by Mr. Cooney that the petition of Frank Visek et al. to vacate Longwood bridge and roads leading thereto, be rejected.

Voting nay, Arthur, Cooney, Carr, Nicholas and Lind.

The chair declared the motion lost.

The clerk read the following resolutions: Whereas, On Dec. 14, 1899 a petition was filed by Frank Visek and others praying for the vacation of what is known as the Longwood bridge, being the bridge crossing the Middle Loup river at a point near the section line between sections 25, 21 and 20, 19, 17 in Custer county, Nebraska, and to vacate the road running east of said bridge to the section corner of sec. 21, 22 and 27 and running west of said bridge to the section corner of sec. 21, 19, 17 and also any other roads leading to said bridge, and

Whereas, the bridge across said Middle Loup river at the town of Comstock near said Longwood bridge is now completed and ready for travel and has been duly accepted by the bridge committee of this board, and

Whereas, it is for the best interests of said county to vacate said Longwood bridge and the said roads leading thereto, and it is for the best interests of the majority of the people in the vicinity of said Longwood bridge to vacate the same, and
