Notice to Bridge Contractors.
Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the county clerk, of Custer county, Neb., until noon of the 18th day of March, 1901, for the furnishing of all material and the labor necessary to build and complete bridges in Custer county, Neb., for the year 1901.

SPECIFICATIONS:
"Filing"—To be white oak or red cedar, according to the order of the county board, 9 in. in diameter at the top or small end.
"Caps"—To be 8x10 in., 30 feet in length; and a strap 2 in. wide and 3/4 in. thick, wrought iron, passing over cap, extending down piling in and secured by fastening with two ag screws, 1 1/2 in. on each side; caps to be fastened to each pile with two iron washers.
"Sway Braces"—3/4 in. x 2 in. cross piling eight and left, extending to cap, fastened with 1/2 in. bolts with iron washers.
"Joists"—To be 9 lines of joists, 8x12, on all spans 20 feet or less in length, and 1 spans over 20 feet to be 11 lines of 8x12 joists. Joists to be fastened by wire nails to caps, and each outside and center line of joists to be fastened to caps with 1/2 in. bolts through caps and joists, with burrs and washers at each end.

"Flooring"—To be 3/4 in. x 12 in. x 16 in. length, to be spiked with 40 d. wire nails, two spikes to each joist in every span completed above.
"Hard rails"—To be dressed; posts to be 4x4 in., 4 feet long and 8 feet apart, securely bolted to joists, with 2x4 in. bolts with burr and washers; cap to be 2x4 in. x 12 in. x 16 in. long and to be 2x2 in. x 12 in. x 16 in. all to be securely fastened to posts with 40 d. wire spikes, and braces from post to post by 40 d. spikes.

"Cross-Bracing"—To be 2x6, securely fastened to each joint by means of 3/4 in. x 40 d. wire spikes; add brace to run from corner to center and from center to corner.
"Packing for Grading"—Each bridge shall have one 8x12 log, 18 feet long, at each end of each bridge, securely fastened to end of joists.
"Painting"—To be painted with one coat of mineral paint.

A material except piling to be of Oregon fir. Contractors will be required to furnish two bids first on bridges of 40 feet and under, second on bridges of greater length. All bids not conforming to specifications will be rejected. Use bond for faithful performance of contract, to be approved by the bridge committee; also complete plans and specifications as to all bridges named in bid, and each bid to be accompanied by a certified check for \$200, payable to the chairman of the board of supervisors, as a guarantee that contract will be entered into if bid is accepted. Work to be paid for in advance on bridge for each span. Proposals must be addressed to the county clerk of Custer county, and marked "Proposals for Bids on Bridges".

The bridge committee will meet on the 14th day of March, 1901, at 9 o'clock a. m., at which time contract will be let.
