HOOPER'S are viewing with amazement the new stocks of wash suits, for these are so sheer and so complicated that it is apparent at a glance they'll not wash. In fact it is to be doubted even if some of these will stand the cleanser's work, they are so frail. Certainly the cleanser who can't treat them without injury deserves to be well paid. Lace is everywhere, coarse and fine, of silk, cotton and wool; no matter what kind of it so long as there is plenty of it. Much of the new lace is in the shades that just match the dress goods and is

very effective. It is a fussy job to have lace dyed to just the right shade, but there are those who know how, and it can easily be imagined that they will charge very high for doing it. One thing is to be said in favor of dyeing laces and that is that it enables a woman to have a gown of chamois, Irish or antique lace she has used this winter cut up and dyed. Then it may be used as trimming for a new colored gown without possibility of its being recognized. Chamois is appearing in a shade that exactly matches the natural pounce color, and it is seen in pattern robes of the pounce where it is simply stunning. Heavy laces are to be used more than the thin silk ones for summer gowns. You see, the delicate nets and chartrily were for

Skirts of the lengths of those pictured are to rule.
