OME of the newer weaves of adobe are even more attractive than were the earlier ones. One that is especially pretty has a silky lustre and makes it resemble all silk poplins. It is very handsome for loose coats, and has so much more body than have many softer fabrics that it will give far better service. There is one point that women should be careful of in providing summer wardrobes, and that is that in their desire to have soft, cool, light materials they do not overlook the matter, because the loose cut of many coats and the soft linings to skirts will tend to

there is wide range in the size of the checks. Many different materials are to be had in this weave, and considerable diversity is evident in the manner of embellishment. Naturally the checked fabrics will be most plentiful in tailor and shirt waist suits. But in the latter they may be discarded, for some shirt waist suits are framed out of almost all suggestion of the garment that gives their name. One of these suits remains in the second illustration. It was natural colored silk poplin with plentiful passementerie trimming headed by black velvet. Cheviots, chamois and coarse linens will be in great favor for the heavier suits, and will be finely serviceable for occasional days in town for those who spend summers in the country or at the shore.

Many summer hats are veritable flowers in garden, and some of the colors seen in the combinations of flowers and ribbons are rather staggering, but on the whole there are less monotonous in headgear than is usual at this season. Many hats show no flowers at all, but where bloom is seen it is likely to be in great profusion. Wide straw hats have the straw of crown or rim literally hidden with flowers. Roses in pink and white are to the fore, and many blossoms with wide petals of "single" arrangement are employed. One beautiful hat had its entire crown of azaleas.
