Hot Strawberry Shortcake. Chop a quart of berries and stir into them a heaping cup of granulated sugar.

Stewed Endive with Cream Sauce. Cut the outer leaves from the desired number of heads of endive and wash the endive thoroughly.

Potato Croquettes. Mix one quart cream with cold mashed potato to make it easy to handle; add a little butter, a beaten egg (to two cups of potato), a tablespoonful of flour and a sprinkle of salt; form into beat little cylinders or cone shapes.

Raspberry Shrub. Allow eight quarts of berries to one pint of acetic acid and four quarts of water. Put all the ingredients into a stone jar and allow the mixture to stand for forty-eight hours, stirring occasionally.

Boiled Cornstarch Pudding. Heat a quart of milk to boiling in a double boiler and stir into it five heaping tablespoonfuls of cornstarch dissolved in a little cold milk.

Short Suggestions. Bottles should never be cleaned with shot, as there is a risk of lead poisoning. Do not scrape a frying pan, as it is liable afterward to burn.

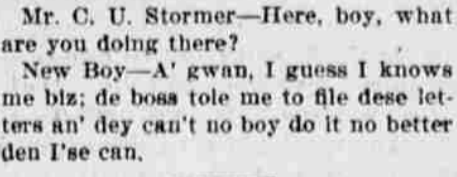
