THE FARMERS WILL FIGHT.

They Demand Some Changes in the New Revenue Law.

LINCOLN-A new non-partisan political organization is being formed in Saline and adjoining counties. The farmers mean to secure several radical changes in the revenue law and are combining to enter the legislative

The agriculturists probably will not return the Saline delegation to the legislature should the present incumbents be renominated. All other aspirants must run the gauntlet on revenue matters before they will be supported.

The plan of organizing is a novel one. The farmers declare that farm assessments are outrageous in comparison with railroad and corporation assessments. An organizer will follow the assessor. Each farmer will be asked to compare the figures this year with the assessment last year.
