then that the national chairman informed them that the men in that hall would be recognized by the national committee as the populist party in Nebraska. The Nebraska Independent, national organ of populism, was turned over to the straight populists by its editor, Mr. Tibbles. A representative of the laboring element was present and pledged the support of organized labor to the movement, provided no fusion was to be effected with any party in the future. He was abundantly reassured on this point.

The gentlemen who adorn the fusion ticket need not be placed under discussion. Sufficient is it to say that an alliance between the prohibitionists and the license advocates could be no more absurd, no more ridiculous, inconsistent and preposterous than the union of Wall Street and the Wall Street opponents.

Which explains why Delegate Stockham of Custer county was able to announce in the "bolters" convention that he had signed a compact with 2,000 other populist leaders not to vote for any man whose name appears upon a fusion ticket.

Fusion of State.

Fusion was accomplished at Lincoln last week between the democrats and populists, to the satisfaction of neither party. The pops demanded all the state candidates but Lieut. Governor, Attorney General and Secretary of State.

After the agreement had been reached to fuse, nearly 100 delegates, representing twenty seven counties met at the capital in a bolt convention to protest against the agreement. The bolt was headed by T. H. Tibbles, populist candidate for vice-president. The bolters propose to reorganize the populist party on an anti-fusion basis. J. H. Stockham, T. H. Tibbles and J. X. Pears were appointed a committee to reorganize populist clubs within the party and to bar all fusionists. W. L. Hand of Kearney, presided at the anti-fusion meeting. Another state convention is contemplated. From reports it appears that neither democrats or pops were satisfied with the terms of the fusion deal and while fusion was agreed upon by the two conventions it will be no more than fusion in name.

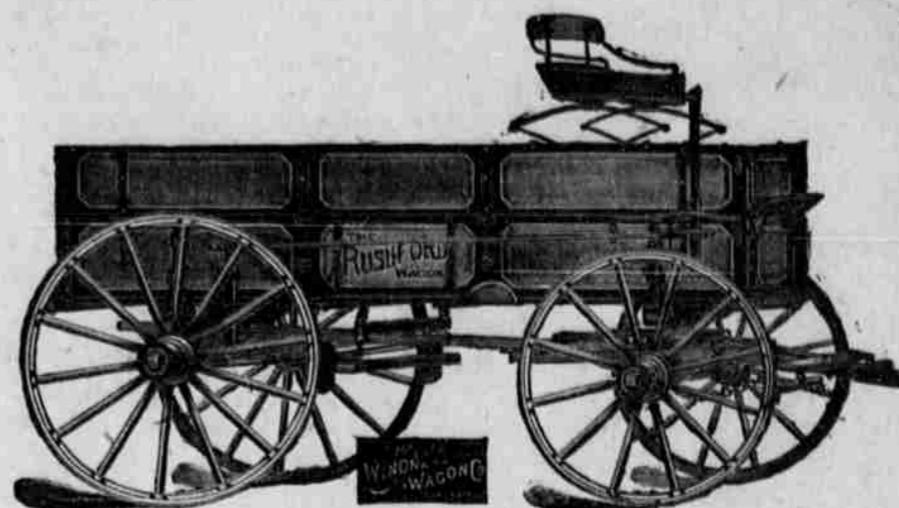
