The Methodist Episcopal is given next with 9,261 ordained ministers and 1,680,779 members, or one minister to each 181 members.

The Methodist Episcopal, (south) is the next in order with 3,593 ordained ministers and 828,013 members, or one minister to each 230 members. This does not include the Protestant Episcopal Methodist or the Protestant Methodist which have a combined membership of 442,040.

The Lutherans are the next in size with a membership of 684,570 members.

The Presbyterians have 4,920 ordained ministers and a membership of 573,377. This does not include the Presbyterian church (south) which has a membership of 119,970, nor the Cumberland Presbyterians with a membership of 111,855.

The Christian or Deciples of Christ come next with an ordained ministry of 3,658 and a membership of 567,448.

The Congregational church is the next in order with 3,589 ordained ministers and 383,876 members.

The United Brethren has 2,200 ordained ministers and a membership of 155,742.

The Reformed Church in U. S. has about one thousand less members than the U. B.

Some thirty other denominations are listed with memberships ranging from 2,000 up to 100,000.
