

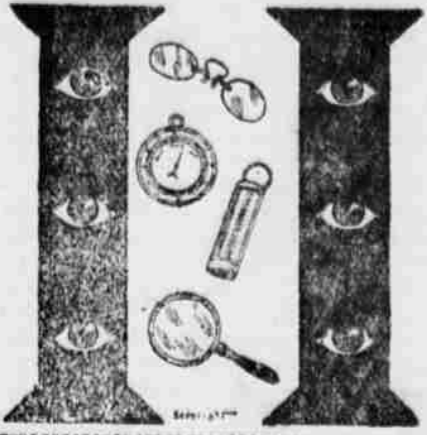

Dec. 27, 1904. Pursuant to adjournment the board met in adjourned session at the court house at 9 a. m. All present except G. Hiser. The entire day was spent in committee work. Adjourned to 9 a. m. tomorrow.

Dec. 28, 1904. Board met at 9 a. m. with all members present. Minutes of yesterday read and approved. Bridge committee reported as follows: W. your committee, recommend that the claim of the Standard Bridge Co. for \$3,188.98, being the balance due on bridge work done by them for Custer county during the year 1904, be allowed.

Geo Greenwalt, A. Fonda, G. H. Thorpe. Report accepted and adopted. Road committee reported as follows: We recommend that the petition of D. J. Smith et al for a change in a road in tp 14, rgs 17, be granted, and that the claim of A. C. Marti be allowed for \$40 to be assessed against road dist. No 5, Algernon Tp. Also that the petition of G. F. Christy et al for a road in tp 19, rgs 20, be granted.

J. T. Arthur, J. H. McGuire, Jos Fenimore. Report accepted and adopted. The application of Jas. Henry et al for a reconsideration of the action of the board, taken on Oct 1st, 1904, on the petition of John Russell et al for a road in tp 15, rgs 23, was read. Moved by McGuire and seconded by Greenwalt that the application be granted and that the action taken on Oct. 1st, on said petition be reconsidered.

On the vote being taken the chairman declared the motion lost. Road committee reported as follows: We recommend that the petition of J. R. Baker et al for the vacation of a road in tp 18, rgs 23, be granted, except 80 rods, commencing at a northeast corner of the n-1/2 sec 22 19 23, running north 80 rods.

Dec. 29, 1904. Board met at 9 a. m. with all members present. Minutes of yesterday read and approved. The forenoon was spent in committee work. Adjourned till 1:30 p. m.

Board met at 1:30 with all present. Road committee reported as follows on the petition of Noah Embree et al for a road in tps 15 and 16 in rgs 22: We recommend that the within petition be granted from stake No. 1 to stake No. 12, and from stake No. 1 east on section line to se corner of the s-1/2 sec 20, and from the sw corner of the s-1/2 sec 20 north 1 mile, to tp 16 rgs 22; and to vacate that part of road asked for in petition, and that the rest of the petition be rejected and damages allowed as follows: E. K. Lichtenberger \$125, R. E. Brega \$40, and E. E. Switzer \$40, to be assessed against road dist. No. 3, Custer precinct, and all other claims be rejected.

Chrisman, in which he proposed that if the board would build a bridge across the creek and allow him to use the same for a stock chute he would not appeal his road damage suit to the supreme court, was taken up for consideration. Moved and seconded that the proposition be accepted.

Ayes and Nays being called, the vote was as follows: Voting Aye: Greenwalt, Fenimore. Voting Nay: Arthur, McGuire, Hiser, Fonda. Whereupon the chair declared the motion lost.

Dec. 31, 1904. Board met at 9 a. m. with all present. Minutes of yesterday read and approved. The special committee, appointed to investigate and report on the claims of Mali Lund and Ole Olson for damages to their land because of a ditch which has been made to drain a road, reported as follows:

We respectfully report that we have examined the premises and find that a ditch about 700 feet long has been cut from the public highway through and across the lands of Mali Lund, that said ditch is from 1 to 20 feet in depth and from 3 to 12 feet wide at the top, and that said ditch was cut in the year 1890 and from our inquiry we find that said ditch was cut with the consent of the then owner and that they received a satisfactory compensation for said ditch at the time the same was constructed.

We further find that if any damages are now due the land owners it is a question for the courts to determine and not the province of this board, and that whatever damages are payable to said land owners should be paid by the road district or township and not by the county. We also recommend that the claims of Mali Lund for \$200 and of Ole Olson be rejected.

We believe that the charges for articles furnished and services rendered by the parties to whom the various amounts were paid by the city of Broken Bow are reasonable and just. We further find that the amount of the claim for which suit has been commenced is \$724.65, and that said suit was commenced on the 10th day of July, 1902.
