Nebraska News

All reports to the contrary, the beet sugar season at Grand Island was a good one.

Citizens of Lincoln are moving in the matter of building a new street railway line.

The Burlington railroad is doing a large amount of riprapping near Nebraska City.

An unknown man committed suicide in the depot at Ames last week. He stood in the waiting room and shot himself with a revolver.

The farmers of Cass county held an old-fashioned wolf hunt. One wolf was caught, while half a dozen broke through the line during the day.

The Uplike Grain company of Omaha is to build a 1,000,000 bushel elevator. It is to be located on land obtained from the Union Stock Yards company.

The wholesale grain firm of Cummings & Laughlin of Beatrice, sold over 100,000 bushels of corn to persons in Missouri, Kansas and Oklahoma.

A telegram was received at Louisville, by Mrs. F. H. Nichols that her brother, Chas. Ross, a brakeman in Montana, had been killed by falling from the train.

H. H. Bartling, head of the Bartling Grain company and mayor of Nebraska City, dropped dead in his place of business. Mr. Bartling was one of the pioneer residents of Otoe county.

While Ed Ruby was chopping wood southwest of Plattsmouth his ax was caught by a limb and, glancing, struck him just back of the right ear, cutting off a portion of the bone and cutting through the ear.

Albert Blacker, convicted of forgery in the Keya Paha county district court last fall, has filed a poverty affidavit in the supreme court stating that he has no funds with which to pay the costs of the appeal.

M. A. Brown of Kearney will carry the electoral vote of Nebraska to Washington and turn it over to the president of the senate. This was decided at a meeting of the electors in the office of Governor Mickey.

Myron T. Richards, who for the last two years has carried the mail to and from the state house to the postoffice, will do the same thing for the next two years. The State Board of Public Lands and Buildings reapportioned him.

William Lewellen, serving out a fine of \$200 in the county jail at Beatrice, for keeping a disorderly house and selling liquor without a license, is suffering from tuberculosis and the city physician will recommend his release at once.

Rev. P. C. Johnson, D. D., of Tecumseh, is being very highly spoken of as a candidate for department commander of the Grand Army of the Republic of Nebraska. Friends of the gentleman from over the state are urging his candidacy.

Two small children, aged six and three years, after traveling alone all the way from Portland, Ore., reached Fremont safely, and were taken in charge by City Ticket Agent Traill who sent them on to Tilden where relatives were expecting them.

William Washington, reported to be the first of the name to go wrong, had executive clemency meted out to him and consequently will not have to serve a year in the penitentiary for forgery. Instead he will spend the time in the Douglas county jail.

Prof. K. Fesenbech of Danbury, Ia., has been selected by the board of education of West Point to fill the position of assistant principal of the High school made vacant by the resignation of Prof. W. V. Niles, who has entered the government service.

A mandate was issued by Harry Lindsay, clerk of the supreme court, to carry out the orders of the court in the matter of Mrs. Margaret Lena Lillie of David City, convicted of the murder of her husband, Mrs. Lillie was sentenced to the penitentiary for life, and will be taken there at once.

The marriage license record of the county judge of Cuming county shows 113 marriage licenses to have been issued during the year 1904. This is twenty-six more than the preceding year. The judge is engaged in demonstrating to interested parties that the increase was caused by last year being leap year.

The Sarpy county mortgage record for the year 1904 is as follows: Town mortgages filed, sixty-six, amounting to \$114,683.95; farm mortgages released, eighty-nine, amounting to \$106,702.08; town mortgages filed, forty-three, amounting to \$28,692.08; town mortgages released, forty, amounting to \$17,119.47.

The largest real estate transfer that ever occurred in Nemaha county was filed for record when Harmon Ray presented deeds transferring his entire real estate possessions in the county of 1,765 acres. The consideration named is \$92,000, over \$52 per acre for Mr. Ray's entire land holdings.

Miss Eva Cooper of Humboldt, who is a student at the state university, has successfully passed the examination required of teachers who enter service at the Philippines, and it is understood will embark upon her new duties at no distant date.

Governor Mickey has refused to issue a requisition for the return to Nebraska of Harvey Springer, who is supposed to be in South Dakota. Springer is charged with stealing \$15 and is believed by the Dakota county authorities to be somewhere in South Dakota.
