BROKEN BOW, June 13, 1905.

Pursuant to the provisions of Sec. 10,520 of the Revised Statutes of the State of Nebraska for the year 1903, the County Board of Equalization of Custer County met at court house in Broken Bow, June 13, 1905. The following members were present: J. T. Arthur, G. H. Greenwalt, Jos Fenimore, A. Fonda, H. B. Schneringer, G. H. Thorpe, B. P. Morris, Jules Haumont.

The chairman appointed the following committees:

For the equalization of live stock, road district and village levies—Fenimore and Thorpe;

For the equalization of real estate, village lots and precinct levies—Fonda and Schneringer;

For the equalization of school district bonds, precinct bonds, village bonds and county levies—Morris, Greenwalt and Arthur.

Moved and carried that all persons making application for adjustment of assessment be required to make the same in writing, verified by oath properly attested.
