

Niagara river, in its course from Lake Erie to Lake Ontario, falls a distance of 627 feet. A survey by the United States engineers, who measured the flow of the river below the falls, shows that it discharges 30,000 cubic feet of water a second from the one lake to the other. By a simple calculation it appears that in its descent of twenty-seven miles from lake to lake, Niagara river develops the aquivalent of about 9,000,000 theoretical horsepower.
