Mr. Johnson, County Attorney appeared before the Board and presented a claim to pay the advance board bill of \$45.00 for Tobe VanGreen Dipomaniac who was sent to the Asylum.

Motion made and carried that the bill be allowed Jos. Fenimore recording no vote to motion.

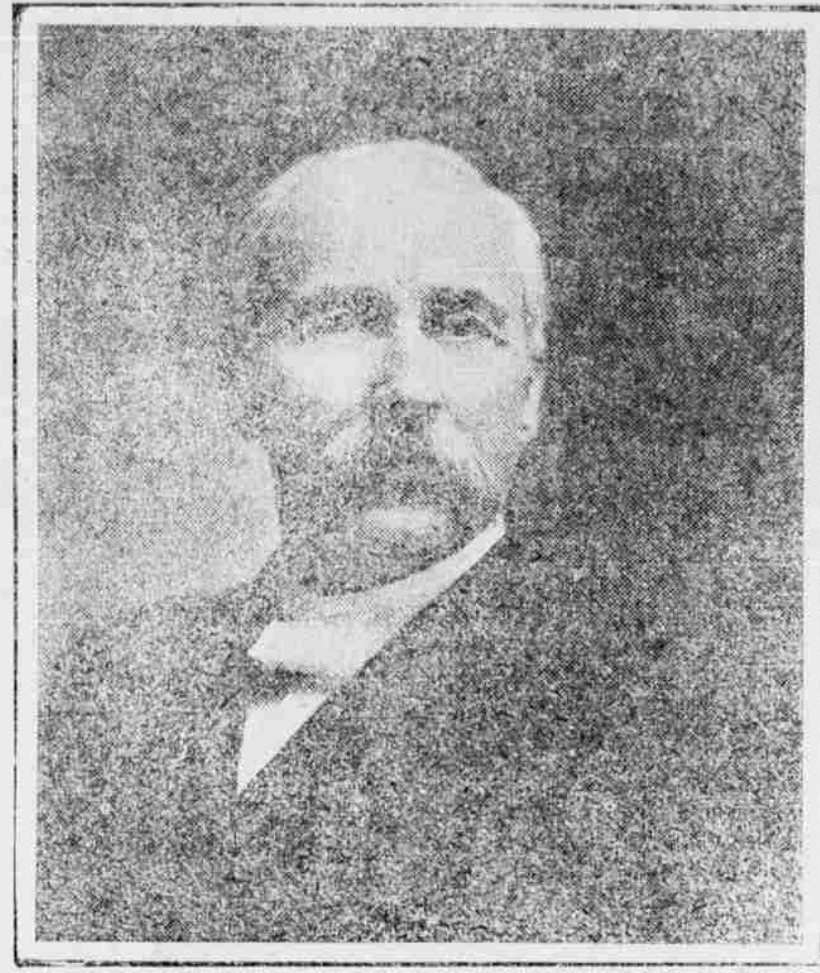
