Supervisor Morris reported that he had sold old lumber to the amount of \$2.00 and had turned the money over to the County Treasurer whose receipt he filed with the County Clerk.

The following requisition of the Register of Deeds was read by the Clerk.

To the Hon. Board of Supervisors. Gentlemen:—I, J. T. Wood, Register of Deeds of Custer County, Nebraska, do respectfully ask: That I be allowed one Deputy at a salary of One Thousand Dollars per year, and one Clerk at Fifty Dollars per month, said clerk to have had six or more months experience, and other necessary clerk hire to keep up work of office at Forty Dollars per month to be paid out of fees of the office.

Moved and carried that the requisition be granted.

The appointment of Geo. E. Porter as Deputy Register of Deeds was read as follows:

To the Hon. Board of Supervisors. Gentlemen:—I, J. T. Wood, Register of Deeds of Custer County, Nebraska, hereby appoint Geo. E. Porter, Deputy Register of Deeds, reserving the right to annul said appointment at any time.

To Hon. Board of Supervisors: Gentlemen:—I, J. T. Wood, Register of Deeds of Custer County, Nebraska, do respectfully ask your Hon. Body to have a committee investigate the necessity of transcribing Range No. 21. This numerical index is in very bad shape and if you deem it necessary you give instructions to order two Blank Range records and that this office be allowed clerk hire to transcribe same and same to be paid out of the general fund.

Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

A petition for the incorporation of the village of Comstock and also for the appointment of a Village Board was read as follows:

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors of Custer County Nebraska.

We, the undersigned, being legal voters of Custer County, Nebraska, and resident freeholders in the village of Comstock in said county of Custer and state of Nebraska, would respectfully petition your honorable body that the following described tract may be declared by you to be an incorporated village, to-wit:

Commencing on the east bank of the Middle Loup River at a point on the section line between sections 2 and 11, township 18, in Custer County, Nebraska; thence east on said section line between the southeast quarter of said section 2, and the northeast quarter of said section 11, marked by a stone, being the one-eighth section corner; thence north from said one-eighth section corner-stone to a point on the half section line of said section 2 produced east and west; thence west on said half-section line so produced east and west to the east bank of the Middle Loup River; thence south and along the east bank of said Middle Loup River to the place of beginning, which said described tract now contains the original town of Comstock according to the recorded plat thereof now on file in the office of the Register of Deeds of Custer County at Broken Bow, Nebraska, and all additions to said original town.

That said tract herein before described may be known and designated "Village of Comstock."

We also respectfully represent that that there are 200 or more inhabitants who actually reside within the above and foregoing described tract.

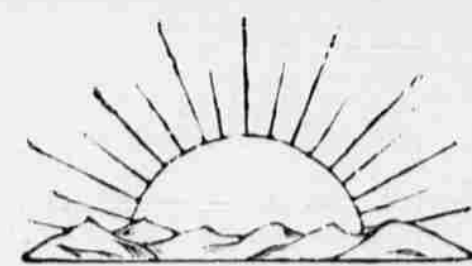
