Obituary.
 Wm. B. Athey was born in Whitley county, Ind., Jan. 14, 1854. He was the second son in a family of nine children.
 When he was 13 years of age he moved with his parents to Jasper county, Ind., where he grew to manhood. At the age of 24 he was united in marriage to Sarah A. Miller. To this union was born 6 sons and 1 daughter, all of whom are still living, except Howard, the second son, who preceded him into the glory of the other world only eight days. In the fall of 1882 he moved with his family, then consisting of a wife and two children, to Custer county, Nebraska, and located near Gates where he resided until 1896 at which time in order to secure better school privileges, he moved to Broken Bow where he was still living at the time of his death, June 11, 1906.
 In 1879 he united with the Methodist Episcopal church and has since been a faithful supporter of that church.

He was a strong advocate of temperance, always casting his influence on the side of right. In his home he was kind and loving yet demanding obedience, and always anxious to render assistance when he thought it beneficial.
 He was a man of strong constitution and his final illness was brief.
 On Wednesday morning, in his usual good health, he had gone to Gates, to settle the affairs of his son Howard and while there felt the symptoms of the same disease that had taken Howard, coming upon him. He hastened home realizing his time here was short and gave his family his final instructions. He lost consciousness before 11 o'clock Thursday from which he partially rallied on Saturday, only to again sink into a deep stupor in which state he remained until Monday evening, peacefully passing away with the last rays of the sun.
 Besides his own family he leaves a father, three brothers, and two sisters to mourn his loss. Tho' his place in the family circle is vacant, and can never be filled, our greatest consolation in our loss is his gain. —X
