The clerk reported that he had on file in his office petitions of various persons requesting that there be submitted to he voters of Custer county at the general election of 1907, the proposition of the erection of three new counties with in the territory of Custer county. R. A. Moore and R. E.Brega, representing the petitioners, and C. H. Holcomb, rep-

resenting certain remonstrators, appeared before the board and discussed the matter of the petitions and the remon strators and it was mutually agreed that the matter go over until to-morrow at 9 o'clock.

The board then adjourned till 9 a m.


