Roosevelt to be Arrested.

A Washington correspondent writes as follows: "The People of the United States vs. Theodore Roosevelt, President", will be the title of a suit that will be filed as soon as the Chief Executive returns from the Isthmus, if James B. Green, a negro lawyer of this city carries out his intention. The lawyer will take up the case of the three companies of the Twenty-fifth Infantry, whom the President discharged because of the Brownsville, Tex., race troubles. The negro soldiers, it will be remembered, refused to divulge the identity of several of their number who engaged in a shooting affray with citizens of the town, and the President forthwith issued a sweeping order discharging the battalion, which took from the members the right to serve again in the military or naval service of the nation, and furthermore abrogated their civil rights. This order, contends Mr. Green, is in direct violation of the Constitution, and he proposes to bring suit to compel the setting aside of the Presidential order and the return of their civil rights to his clients. Only by a court martial, can men be punished as the President punished them, is the contention.

One Standing Issue.

Mr. Bryan's solemn announcement that in 1908 the issue will be whether the trusts will swallow the nation or be swallowed by it instead became farcical the instant it was spoken. President Roosevelt has knocked that issue into a cocked hat. Modern Democracy has one standing issue, and that is Tariff smashing. Individuals in the party have fads which they sometimes impose on conventions. What Mr. Bryan really wants to have for an issue is Government ownership of transportation lines for goods, passengers and news. Apparently he thinks twenty billions is nothing for this country to spend for that purpose.

Land of Murderers.

Judge Kavanagh, of Chicago, is quoted as saying that, "during the last five years, 45,000 persons were murdered in the United States. More persons were murdered last year than died of typhoid fever. This awful total has been due to the way in which the law was administered. And the law itself is bad and inefficient. It is burdened with restrictions and technicalities, and in almost every case the criminal has nine chances of escaping to one of being found guilty."

Bryan's Career.

Mr. Bryan's career in official public life is limited to two terms in Congress, in which his most notable performance was a long and elaborate speech in favor of Free-Trade. He is now, as then, opposed to any Tariff Protection for American industries or wages. His position on political questions tends to lessen American employment and wages. It would also limit American opportunities for the poor man, which was Mr. Bryan's condition ten years ago, when, with a great leap of promotion, he was placed at the head of one of the leading parties and gained, as by one magical stroke, a place in the attention of the world. Such an event could happen nowhere except in this great Republic, now in its most prosperous era under the policies of the party which Mr. Bryan seeks to defeat, though its control for nearly ten years has been marked by immense strides forward and by highly important legislation in behalf of a square deal for all the people.
