NEBRASKA NEWS AND NOTES

GATHERED FROM EXCHANGES AND PRESS DISPATCHES.

Miscellaneous Items of Interest Bearing Upon Many Subjects of General Concern.

The People's bank of Upland has opened its doors for business.

The decree has gone forth in Neigh that joints must be suppressed.

The Jacob Schill Clothing store at Nebraska City burned. Loss \$12,000.

The Presbyterians of Blue Hill are holding a series of religious meetings.

Germans of Humboldt will erect a new church this year at a cost of \$5,000.

Smallpox is prevalent at Silver Creek, as several families are quarantined.

At Holdreth a ruffian attacked Frela Beck and cut off all her hair. He was not captured.

The father of the editor of the Greeley Citizen last week celebrated his ninetieth birthday.

A new M. E. church is to be forthcoming in Rulo as the result of revival meetings in that place.

Work of double-tracking of the Union Pacific will go forward as soon as the weather will permit.

At Nebraska City the son of Herman Hertzog had his ankle and foot crushed by a horse falling on him.

Henry L. Gembler, a young farmer near Glenville, was adjudged insane and was taken to the Lincoln hospital.

A wolf hunt was held near Barneson, but no wolves were captured. Over 100 farmers participated in the hunt.

Mrs. Adelia Jones, living five miles south of Table Rock, has sold her farm of a hundred and sixty acres for \$10,400.

William Meyers, an old German blacksmith of Indianola, was found dead in his room in the back part of his shop.

A burglar broke into a saloon at Nebraska City and stole \$10. He overlooked a much larger sum that was near by.

Kearney people are jubilant over the promise of more than ordinary activity in and about Kearney on the part of the Union Pacific.

Harm Huls, a farmer living near Pickrell, who was sent to the hospital for the insane as an inebriate three months ago, has been paroled.

James Stafford was found wandering aimlessly around the sand hills near Alliance. He was sent to the home of his brother, near Sidney.

An effort is being made by Rev. J. S. Busse to interest the residents in a chautauque, to be held in Nebraska City next summer at Morton park.

C. G. Pearce, formerly superintendent of schools at Omaha, and now holding a like position in Milwaukee, has been re-elected for another term.

An objection has been raised to the Chicago shine dance in Fremont, and the police have asked couple who are in the habit of dancing it to "cut it out."

D. C. McIntyre, Burlington yard foreman, who was run down and seriously injured by a switch engine in the yards at Alliance died from his injuries.

At a meeting of the directors of the Beatrice Driving association the resignations of W. A. Penner as president and William Hamm as first vice president were presented and accepted.

James Scilley of North Platte has gone to Lexington to wind up the business for the Standard Beet Sugar company. He does not know what business he will undertake in the future.

President Carrington of the South-eastern teachers' association which meets April 4 to 7, visited the normal at Peru. A strong program is being arranged for the annual session in April.

The body of Rev. A. Foyer, who died from pneumonia at Sumner was brought to Sutherland for burial Thursday. Deceased had been a resident of that section nearly twenty years.

In a wolf hunt at Utica, Matt Lief was unfortunate enough to have his left leg nearly shot off. How the accident happened he is not able to tell, nor can any of his friends that were with him at the time.

John Buckner, a farmer residing near Nehawka, Cass county, took a load of stock to South Omaha and sold it for \$500. Then he formed the acquaintance of two strangers, who relieve him of about half of his cash.

Dr. C. A. McKim, Nebraska state veterinarian, is anxious for a bill to be passed in this state providing local inspection of meat and dairy products because of the increase of tuberculosis among hogs and also human beings.

At Odessa Charley Frederick, while building a fire in the kitchen range, had a narrow escape from death by the stove exploding. One stove lid went through the ceiling and an inch board above. Pieces of the range flew in all directions.

At the last meeting of the Lyons board of trustees an ordinance was passed levying an occupation tax upon all fire insurance companies, the proceeds to go toward maintaining a proper fighting force in the newly organized Lyons fire department.

The W. F. Smith company of Kearney, made two big deals in one day, selling the Vangren ranch near Callaway to Henry Ritter of Elgin for \$35,000, and a flouring mill at Dodge, to Mr. Wescott, who was the man selling the ranch, at a consideration of \$20,000.
