**Board of Equalization Proceedings**

the report of the committee be accepted and adopted as read.  
It was moved and carried that B. J. Tierney be served with the following notice:

You are hereby notified that on this 12th day of June, 1907, the board of supervisors of Custer county, Nebraska, sitting as a board of equalization made an order for you to show cause on the 15th day of June, 1907, at 1:30 o'clock p. m. before said board of equalization at the court room in Broken Bow, Nebraska, why they should not add to your assessment for the year 1907, 440 head of fat cattle which you owned in Custer county, Nebraska, on the first day of April, 1907.

You are therefore notified to appear before said board on said 15th day of June, 1907, at 1:30 p. m. and show cause, if any there be, why the same should not be placed upon your assessment and upon the tax list of said year. By order of the county board sitting as a board of equalization. Made this 12th day of June, 1907.

Mr. Edward Squires, attorney for B. J. Tierney, accepted service of said notice, and asked, and was granted leave to be heard on Thursday morning June 13th, 1907.

At 6 p. m. the board adjourned till 9 o'clock tomorrow morning.  
**THURSDAY, JUNE 13, 1907.**  
Board met at 9 a. m. with all present. Minutes of yesterday read and approved. The forenoon was spent in committee work and at 12 m. the board adjourned till 1:30 p. m.

**AFTERNOON SESSION**  
The matter of the assessment of B. J. Tierney's fat cattle was then taken up. Mr. Tierney appeared before the board, and his attorney, Mr. Squires, presented the following affidavit in support of his claim:  
State of Nebraska, } ss.  
Custer County, } ss.  
I, B. J. Tierney, being first duly sworn, on oath say: That I maintain a ranch and ranch business in Logan County, Nebraska, and in connection with said ranch and its business, I have a large number of cattle.

Said cattle are raised upon said ranch, are a part of its business and when sold, the proceeds thereof are credited to said ranch business. That the headquarters and principal place of business, is on said ranch in said county of Logan. Affiant states that in the fall of 1906, he had on said ranch, and as a part of its business, 440 head of cattle, some of which were feeding steers, some heifers and some cows. Affiant states that on account of lack of feed obtainable at said ranch, in November 1906 said cattle were driven temporarily to the town of Ansely, and there fed out; but at no time were the same segregated from the business of said ranch, but at all times were a part thereof. That said cattle were taken from said ranch, their destination was to be the market at South Omaha, Nebraska. That their detention at Ansely was temporary only and the same did not alter the fact said cattle after leaving said ranch, were at all times in transit to said city of South Omaha, and while fed at Ansely, they were at all times connected with and were a part of the business of said ranch in Logan County, Nebraska. That said cattle were not connected with any farm or business having its situs in Custer County.

Affiant states that on or before the 17th day of April 1907 said cattle were all duly listed and assessed by the County Assessor of Logan County, Nebraska, and that a duplicate schedule of said assessment is hereto attached and is made a part hereof. Affiant further states that said cattle have been wrongfully listed and assessed by the County Assessor of Custer County, Nebraska, and respectfully requests that the same be stricken from the assessment rolls of said County of Custer.

Affiant further states that 270 head of said cattle were estimated by the County Assessor of Custer County to weigh 1300 lbs per head. That said estimate was too large by at least 100 lbs per head.

Affiant further states that said 270 head of cattle were valued at 4 1/2 cents per lb but that said estimate of value was too high by at least one-half cent per pound.

Affiant further states that 270 head of said cattle were by the Assessor in Custer County Nebraska, estimated to weigh 1100 lbs each and valued at 4 1/2 cents per lb. That said estimate of value so made was too high at least 1/2 cent per lb. And while Affiant at all times insists that said cattle should not be assessed in Custer County Nebraska, yet urges and complains that if the same should be assessed in said County that they are at present assessed too high and the actual value thereof should be reduced at least by the sum of \$3770.00.

As per adjournment Board met at 1:30 p. m. as a Board of Equalization and at 3 p. m. adjourned till 1:30 p. m. tomorrow  
**SATURDAY JUNE 15th, 1907.**  
Board met at 1:30 p. m. with all members present. Bernard Beechler appeared before the Board in answer to the Summons issued on the 11th day of June 1907 and Deputy Assessor W. E. Warren, F. R. Woolington, and Bernard Beechler, were sworn and testified, and after due consideration, it was moved by Haumont, seconded by Welch, that there be added to the assessment of Bernard Beechler, and placed on the Tax List for the year 1907, cash to the amount of \$4800.00, and that the assessment as regards to the wheat remain at 500 bushels, the same as returned by the Assessor.  
Motion carried.  
It was moved and carried that the costs of this suit be taxed to Bernard Beechler, whereupon the said Bernard Beechler immediately paid said costs.
