Broken Bow, Neb., July 29th, 1907.

Pursuant to adjournment of July 15th 1907, the County Board of Supervisors, met at the court house in Broken Bow, at 9 o'clock a. m. and was called to order by the chairman.

The roll was then called, and the following answered present:

The following communication was then read by the clerk.

We your special committee appointed to check the Register of Deeds office, respectfully report that we have compared the report with the records of the office, and find the same correct as reported by J. T. Wood, Register of Deeds.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Board met at 1:30 p. m. with all members present.

The county clerk reported that he had on file in his office, petitions of various persons, requesting that there be submitted to the voters, of Custer County, Nebraska, at the general election of 1907, the question of the erection of two new counties, to be known as Higgins County and Arbor County, within the territory of Custer County.

The Chairman appointed Jos. Fenimore and J. B. Gilmore as a committee to check over the names of the petition from the SW. 1/4 known as Arbor County and also appointed J. E. Grint and R. R. Welch, as a committee to check over the names of the petition from the NE. 1/4 known as Higgins County.

The committee appointed to investigate the petition of the proposed new county of Arbor, submitted the following report:

We find that the petition contains 1097 names.

That 51 of the signers of said petition signed the same twice.

Also that 1 has died, and that 1 lives in the NW. 1/4 of Custer County and not in the proposed new county of Arbor, which leaves 1044 names on the petition.

We find by the abstract of votes for the year 1906, furnished by the County Clerk, there were polled 826 votes, and further find that said petition contains a majority of 631 signers.

We further find that the proposed new County of Arbor will contain 720 square miles.

We therefore recommend that the petition be granted, and that the question of the erection of the proposed new County of Arbor, be submitted to a vote of the people of Custer County, Nebraska, at the next general election, and that notice be given, and the vote canvassed as is required by law in such cases, and that the form of the ballot shall be, (For the new County of Arbor) and, (Against the new County of Arbor.)

The committee appointed to investigate the petition of the proposed new County of Higgins, made the following report.

We find that the petition contains 742 names.

We find by the abstract of votes, for the year 1906, furnished us by the County Clerk, there were polled 1074 votes, and further find that said petition contains a majority of 204 signers.

We further find that the proposed new County of Higgins will contain more than 450 square miles.

We therefore recommend, that the petition be granted, and that the question of the erection of the proposed new County of Higgins, be submitted to a vote of the people of Custer County, Nebraska, at the next general election, and that notice be given, and the vote canvassed as required by law in such cases, and that the form of the ballot shall be, (For the new County of Higgins) and, (Against the new County of Higgins).
