## More Money for Exhibitors

The Custer County Fair Management Have Added Additional Premiums to the Already Large List

### HERE IS A CHANCE FOR YOU

The management of the Custer County Fair have decided to give to each of the first fifty persons who bring to the fair after the same opens on Tuesday morning and before the closing time for entry of farm products, a check of \$2.00 and two season tickets, provided the exhibit contains the following farm products: 1st, a collection of corn; 2nd, winter wheat; 3rd, spring wheat; 4th, oats; 5th, barley and speltis, if possible; 6th, Millet; 7th, alfalfa, in sheaf or this year's grain; 8th, broom grass; 9th, sugar cane; 10th, musk melons; 11th cantaloupes; 12th, squashes; 13th pumpkins; 14th, potatoes; 15th onions; 16th, turnips; 17th tomatoes and other vegetables.

This premium will not be paid unless the exhibit contains at least twenty different varieties. All grain must be in sheaf or stalk. The same products may be offered for premium. In other words, you get \$2.00 and two season tickets for making the exhibit and in addition you are entitled to the regular premium. See premium list and if you have not got a list write to the secretary for one.

### A Cure, Likewise Preventative.

The Loup Valley Queen of recent date gave out the following as a cure and preventative for a disease which has been thinning the hog ranks in many parts of the state:

"Willard Twist, residing at the west edge of this city, informs the Queen that he is positive he has found a cure and preventative for the disease which has been the cause of so many hogs dying over the county. He says that his next door neighbor, August Wirsching, doctored his hogs for cholera, but the medicine seemed to do but little good, and Mr. Wirsching lost in all 28 head. About the same time the herd of Mr. Twist took sick, and in a pint of milk he put two drachms of sulphate of soda, one drachm of powdered castor beans and five drops of carbolic acid; and fed it to his herd, and although his hogs were as sick as any of them, he did not lose one. To prevent those in another pen from getting sick, he gave them potash. He is positive that the above ingredients will cure any of them from the disease that has been so fatal to the hog family.

### Why Is It?

Bert Walker in Osborne Farmer: Here is one thing we wish someone would explain to us. Why is it that the speech of Robert M. LaFollette at Lincoln park last Monday made such a hit with the opposition to the Republican party?
